4. The first party would coordinate and convene periodic (monthly/ quarterly) review meetings with the executive committee. This meeting would address solutions of problems that are put up by the 2nd party to facilitate implementation of the project as per timeline.

Roles of the second party:

- 5. The second party will be responsible for upkeep and maintenance of various clinical infrastructure, facilities and equipment to provide clinical services like outdoor and investigation (pathology, radio diagnostic, optometry, cardiac care, dental care, physiotherapy etc..) services in phased manner.
- The second party would be responsible to undertake corrective actions immediately or within reasonable time to respond based on monitoring observations by the 1st party.
- The second party would coordinate and convene periodic (monthly/ quarterly) review meetings with the executive committee. This meeting would address solutions of problems that are put up by the 1st party to facilitate implementation of the project as per timeline.

That, the both parties agree to work on a detailed project design and activities including resource sharing plan within 1 month of signing of this agreement.

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MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

This Memorandum of Understanding (hereinafter referred to as "MoU") is made and entered into BY and BETWEEN

Banking Finance and Insurance Institute of Nepal Limited (BFIN), having its office at 2nd floor, Krishna Tower, New Baneshwor, Kathmandu, Nepal and represented through its **Managing Director Dr Binod Atreya** (hereinafter referred to as "BFIN") which expression, shall unless it be repugnant to the subject or the context thereof, includes its successors and assigns;

AND

Centurion University of Technology & Management (CUTM) having its office at 17, Forest Park, Bhubaneswar PIN – 751009, Dist: Khurda, Odisha, India and represented through its **President - Prof Mukti K Mishra** (herein referred to as "CUTM") which expression, shall unless it be repugnant to the subject of the context thereof, includes its successors and assigns;

"BFIN" and "CUTM" are hereinafter referred individually as "Party" and collectively as "Parties".

1. Description of Both Institutions:

- 1.1. Banking, Finance and Insurance Institute of Nepal (BFIN) is established under Company Act 2063 on August 14, 2018. BFIN is promoted by 16 national level institutions of Nepal represented by commercial banks, development banks, finance companies, micro credit institutions, capital market institutions and the Emerging Nepal Limited. The main objectives of BFIN are to offer training, workshop and seminar and enhance the knowledge, skills and capabilities of the employees of financial sector and other stakeholders, conduct research and consulting to strengthen the financial sector, offer specific accredited courses and creating data bank for the use of banking community and help to strengthen the financial systems in Nepal.
- 1.2. Centurion University of Technology & Management (CUTM) began in the year 2005 by a group of ambitious academics with aspirations to provide high quality education both nationally and internationally. The first step in this direction was to take over an ailing engineering Institute, the Jagannath Institute for Technology and Management (JITM) in one of the most challenging tribal districts of Odisha and one which was considered to be a left-wing extremist affected area. Subsequently, JITM was transformed into Centurion University of Technology and Management in August 2010, through an act of Odisha Legislative Assembly. It became the First Multi-Sector State Private

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University in Odisha. The core objective of CUTM is 'shaping lives and empower communities', and creating wealth and livelihood opportunities at the bottom of the pyramid. The objective is achieved through education and training, financial services and other projects in rural communities, particularly in southern Odisha and northern coastal Andhra Pradesh. CUTM has strong environmental as well as social values. The University leads a network of educational institutions delivering primary, secondary, tertiary and vocational education and training. CUTM evolved from the Jagannath Institute of Technology and Management (JITM) and Centurion School of Rural Enterprise Management (CSREM) at Parlakhemundi, and the Centurion Institute of Technology (CIT) at Jatni, Bhubaneswar

2. Purpose of Memorandum of Understanding (MoU)

The purpose of this Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) is to underpin the development of a long-term partnership between BFIN and CUTM for conducting and coordinating in the areas of training, education, research and consultancy Services, Information Technology and other allied services offered by both Institutions.

It therefore, sets out matters of agreed principles and policies, reflecting the spirit of co-operation between BFIN and CUTM as hereunder:

3. Aims and Objectives of the Joint Activity:

- 3.1. Both the institutions agree to collaborate in various areas like organizing joint workshops,
 - training programs, exposure visits, study tours, seminars and conferences on various emerging topics and to offer / organize any other program/activity/event mutually agreeable to both the Parties.
- 3.2 **BFIN and CUTM**, in future, if need arises, and subject to various regulatory/statutory and other clearances, will explore/examine and mutually agree through a separate MOU for providing professional accredited short term and long term diploma/degree courses in the areas of cooperative management, technology, banking, finance, management, and its modality of operation, examination, cost structure and on completion of the course, for receiving certification from CUTM.
- 3.3 Both Institutions agree to enhance staff and Executive development opportunities by fully exploiting the strengths of both institutions, to the benefit of all concerned.

4. Agreement between BFIN and CUTM

4.1. The Parties agree to collaborate in various areas like organizing joint workshops, training programs, seminars and conferences on various emerging topics and to offer / organize any other program/activity/event within the competence of both the Institutions, whenever any-







such need/requirement is proposed either by BFIN or by CUTM.

- 4.2. Both the Parties may offer their office infrastructures and facilities, subject to availability, at mutually agreed minimum cost basis or free of cost as appropriate, to each other or arrange the same for conducting events, programs, training, etc.
- 4.3. Both the parties in collaboration shall explore to hold some training, conferences, exposure visit, etc., in Nepal and/or India or in any other country for enhancing the knowledge and skills of officials of both countries.
- 4.4. Both the Parties agree to promote the common programs on their respective websites & other social media platforms, as and when required.
- 4.5. Both the parties agree to acknowledge as "Preferred Partner" in domain of expertise offered by both the institutions and support each other.
- 4.6. Both the parties agree to use their Logo and strategic alliance related information at their websites and in other formal publications.
- 4.7. Both the parties agree to support each other with the exchange of faculties or resource persons, while hosting conference, training and webinars. The faculty can be drawn from CUTM and BFIN, government, CEOs and senior level officials from BFIs, academicians in respective fields, available within and outside of both the countries.
- 4.8. Both the parties agree to find out scholarship/ grant/fund, as appropriate, for hosting the joint programs. The terms and conditions for hosting joint programs shall be decided project-wise.
- 4.9. Both the parties agree to provide access to their respective network and alliances for mutual benefits and strengthening relationships.
- 4.10. While hosting a customized program, general program, conference and seminar and the certified long-term diploma and degree courses in Nepal; the fees will be decided at the time of finalization of each program separately after mutual discussion with representatives of BFIN and CUTM.
- 4.11.Both the parties agree to support each other with course outlines, reading materials, case studies, books and journals; and other relevant information such as online library as applicable; for the use of other and enhance the knowledge base of both the institutions.
- 4.12. Gram Tarang Inclusive Development Services Private Limited (GTIDS), an entrepreneurial outreach of CUTM is active in Financial Inclusion space and working as a Business Correspondent for various Public Sector Banks across India. GTIDS & BFIN shall explore

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the possibility of extending these services in Nepal.

5. Sponsored Research and Consulting Services

Under this arrangement, both BFIN and CUTM agree for exploring to collaborate in Research and Consulting activities in the areas of mutual interest and benefit. Such sponsored research will be fostered through the interactions with faculty members of CUTM and senior executives of BFIN to arrive at research problems. The financials and other terms and conditions of the research and consulting assignments will be as per mutual agreement, which will depend upon the duration of the project expertise required, research inputs and other incidental expenses.

6. Investment in Nepal

- 6.1. CUTM "in principle' agree to offer the following technical services to BFIN and other banks and financial institutions, subject to approval from the legal and regulatory authorities of both the countries:
 - 6.1.1. Planning, conducting feasibility studies for the establishment of technical and vocational Institute/college in collaboration with BFIN and BFIs along with other central or local government partnership.
 - 6.1.2. Investment in equity participation as agreed between CUTM and Nepalese partners subject to approval from the legal and regulatory authorities of both the countries and financial capacities of CUTM.
 - 6.1.3. Transfer of technical knowledge, such as course design, education, examination and certification.
 - 6.1.4. Deputation of technical expertise to help establish Technical Institute/College.
 - 6.1.5. Transfer of models of operation of CUTM (rules , regulations, policies, procedures, etc.) to help start a Technical Institute/College in Nepal.
 - 6.1.6. Any other work related to establishment of Technical and vocational Institute and its implementation.

7. Case Studies

Case studies are an important component of executive and organizational development and training. BFIN and CUTM would explore/attempt to jointly identify various areas where the faculty associated with BFIN and CUTM will document the situations, or success story/challenges faced through writing the case studies. The case studies developed can also be used by both the organizations for its internal training programs. Both the institutions may publish the case studies in appropriate leading journals after obtaining consent from each other as well as from leading case clearing houses, thereby enhancing the brand visibility of both the

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8. Administration:

- 8.1. The authorized signatories / designated representatives of both the Parties shall take requisite actions under this MoU. The designated representatives of the Parties would be responsible for developing and carrying out joint plans and regular reports on the implementation of this MoU.
- 8.2. For the purpose of smooth implementation of the terms of MoU, the Parties agree to mutually decide upon the operational aspects / procedure, including, roles & responsibilities of each Party, financial aspects and such other terms & conditions for each program.
- 8.3. It is agreed that for the purpose of facilitating / implementation terms of this MOU, both the Parties agree to have regular communication and correspondence.
- 8.4. Each Party shall appoint a Coordinator in their respective offices who shall be responsible for coordinating all communication. A coordinator will be appointed for each program/event/activity separately, who in turn will internally coordinate within their respective institutions with regard to working out of the operational and financial aspects. All the operational and financial aspects will be operationalized after acceptance of all the terms by both the Parties by exchange of letters.
- 8.5. The Parties hereby represent and warrant as of the date hereof, that both the institutions are duly incorporated with valid licenses, have power to execute functions mentioned in this MOU, have skills and knowledge to abide this MOU, to perform the functions; and agree that the execution of this MOU shall not violate the provisions of law and order, and the Article of Association and other legal provisions of both the countries.
- 8.6. Both the parties agree that in a process to delivery of services as per this MOU shall not harm the other party, nor make any claim to any right or asset or property, whatsoever, and agree that this MOU is purely to develop professional relations between both the institutions and spread the knowledge base in the region.

9. Amendment

Any amendment / alteration to this MOU shall be decided mutually between the Parties hereto and shall be by way of an addendum to the MOU.

10. Validity and Termination

10.1 The MOU shall become effective on the date of this document is executed by the authorized officials of both the Parties and shall remain in force for a **period of five years**. Upon the completion of this term, the MOU may be renewed for a further period of three years or a mutually agreed period upon the assent of both the Parties by execution of

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10.2 Either party may terminate this MOU by written notification signed by the authorized official of that Party. However, the other Party must receive such notification at least 30 days in advance. The termination of this MOU shall not affect the rights and obligations of the Parties prior to such termination. It is clarified that if any course / event / activity has already been initiated then the termination, if any, shall be effective only after completion of the course for that year and before the commencement of the next course.

11. Undertaking by BFIN and CUTM

The Parties hereby undertake to work closely and cooperate in the implementation of this MOU and to endeavor to resolve disputes arising between them in relation to this MOU by amicable means. In the event that the Parties are unable to resolve any dispute by amicable means, then this MOU may be terminated by mutual consent of both the parties subject to completion of ongoing events / programs.



Whereas, CUTM's School of Paramedics and Allied Health Sciences is approved by State Allied Medical Council of Odisha or Director Medical Education & Training (DMET).

Whereas, CUTM is interested to send its students for practical training to the hospital as per the requirement of INC (Indian Nursing Council) & DMET guidelines, to which the Hospital is agreed to give practical exposure to the students of CUTM on the following terms and conditions:

- 1. This agreement shall be restricted to academic only cannot be used for commercial purpose.
- 2. The Students shall undergo training during the Shifts as per the protocol of the hospital.
- 3. CUTM shall furnish the name, address, photographs and other relevant details of the concerned student supported by documentary evidence, viz., Aadhaar Card, Voter ID, University ID Card to the hospital along with the department in which he/she wants to take training.
- 4. The Hospital shall issue temporary ID cards to the students during the period of training and the same shall be returned to the Hospital on the last day of completion of training at the Hospital. During the training, the students shall wear the temporary ID card, failing which they shall be treated as absent.

5. - 9. During the period of training, if any mishap occurs at the workplace, the hospital shall not be held responsible for the same. The students shall undergo the training purely at his/her own risk.

- 12. The Student Internship opportunity provided to the students in no way ascertains any commitment to give any job opportunity or placement in any way and it is the sole discretion of the other party
- 13. The Hospital reserves its right to terminate the MOU for any disciplinary issues, even without serving any prior notice to CUTM. However, The Hospital and CUTM individually is at liberty to terminate the agreement by giving two months' notice to the other party in writing.
- 14. Onus lies on CUTM to bear the cost of accommodation, transportation and food expenses of the students during the tenure of the agreement.
- 15. CUTM shall not utilize name and logo of the hospital in any form without written permission of the hospital.

16. Onus lies on CUTM to send minimum **30** Students (which may exceed), for six-month internship in the hospital along with regular training. The courses offered by CUTM SEC-1 (SoPAHS) and intake capacity of the course are attached in ANNEXURE 1.

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17. Indemnification:

CUTM shall indemnify and continue to indemnify to the Hospital against all proceedings, claims, demands and financial loss, if any, in respect thereof pertaining to the training and any act of the Students during the period of training.

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Duration:

The MOU shall be for a period of 5 years with effect from the date of signing of the MoU and will be automatically extended for a similar period of 5 years unless otherwise agreed by writing.

18. General:

CUTM shall not utilize the name and logo of the hospital for the purpose of advertisement in any form.

19. Any dispute arising between the parties shall be resolved by amicable settlement and in case of failure shall abide by the jurisdiction at Bhubaneswar.



Annexure 2

Internship/ Project Amendment at Ashwini Hospital

The Internship of the students of SoPAHS will be carried out at the Hospital as approved by the University. The Internship component shall have 100 percentage points divided equally between Internal and External evaluation.

The Segregation of marks for the purpose of Evaluation will be as follows:

(i) Log report/ daily report (signed by Company person/ Organization in the field) - 10%

(ii) Report submission (log report to be a part of the report) - 20% weightage

(iii) Assessment by the Organization where internship is carried out - 40% weightage

(iv) Presentation and Viva at Department level - 20% weightage.

(v) Clinical case study - 10% weightage

The Project work is to be carried out by the Intern in their Final Semester, parallel to Internship curriculum at the respective Hospital. Each student shall do a project/ dissertation under the supervision of a Supervisor as a part of the Course structure. The evaluation shall be done by a committee of teachers including an External Expert where the Project Supervisor shall be a member. The relative weightage of the components is provided in Annexure I.

Grading System:

University follows a nine-point grading system on base of 10-point scale according to the performance of a student in all subject items. The regulation for grades along with the corresponding grade points will be based on the Examination Policy by the University.

Horendance rules:

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m attendance requirement for appearing for examinations will be 75%. The same SECaften and rules will be applicable for appearing internal examination as well. Condoning of Anita Pater

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the minimum attendance either due to medical or any other reasons as allowed by the Dean of the School remains limited to a maximum of 10%. The Overall weightage of attendance is 5% and the segregation of marks for attendance is as follows:



Hereinafter both the parties jointly will be referred to as "parties" and establish the agreement as follows:

Whereas:

- Centurion University has decided to provide academic programs through online using technology, internet, and both based on relevant regulations in force time to time.
- Talentedge Education Ventures Pvt. Ltd. would provide technology support to Centurion University in regard to student enrolment, licencing of multimedia courses, aid in internet-based delivery and student management services to all the students enrolled into Online Programs offered by Centurion University as mutually agreed in writing by both the parties periodically.

1. General Provisions

1.1 Scope of this Agreement

Both parties recognize and acknowledge that the present Agreement is solely an arrangement to facilitate technology and coordination between Centurion University & Talentedge Education Ventures Pvt. Ltd. for total support to the students of Online Programs and the delivery of the Programs via technology, internet or both. The Second Party is not authorized to and shall not admit students in respect of the Programs but only provide technology services to Centurion University for Online Programs, including dissemination of details of the Online Platform and Programs. This agreement shall not amount to a Franchisor-Franchisee relationship.

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1.2 Talentedge Education Ventures Pvt. Ltd. has exclusive rights to support the University with technology and Services in helping the University solicit, enroll students and deliver all the courses under the Directorate of Online Programs offered by Centurion University.

2. Definitions

In this agreement, unless the context otherwise requires, the following terms shall have the meaning assigned to them with the normal grammatical variation.

- 2.1 "First Party" or "University" and/or "Centurion University" means Centurion University who is a party to this agreement.
- 2.2 "Educational Technology Service provider" or "Second Party" and/or "TALENTEDGE" means Talentedge Education Ventures Pvt. Ltd, who is a party to this agreement providing technology support to Centurion University for Online Programs.
- 2.3 "Programs" means all the agreed Programs
 - 2.3.1That are Online Undergraduate Degree Programs and Online Post Graduate Degree programs offered by the Directorate of Online Programs of CENTURION UNIVERSITY and approved by UGC, given in Annexure-I.
- 2.4 Under this agreement, the term "Students" means all students who are pursuing the Online Programs under the Directorate of Online Programs of Centurion University who have either enrolled or undergoing academic sessions.
- 2.5 "Programs under this agreement" means all the Programs offered by the Directorate of Online programs of Centurion University and mutually agreed in writing by the parties periodically.
- 3. Obligations of The Education Technology Service Provider (Talentedge Education Ventures Pvt. Ltd.) for Programs as defined in Clause 2.3



3.1 Talentedge Education Ventures Pvt. Ltd. will assist Centurion University in soliciting and enrolling students in its Online Programs on Venture via the domain name www. cuedu.in/ supported and managed by Talentedge Education Ventures Pvt. Ltd.

- a. The domain name www. cuedu.in/ shall exclusively facilitate enrolment and offer Online delivery to all the students of the Directorate of Online Degree Programs.
- b. The domain name www. cuedu.in shall facilitate the student's admission to all the offline and online support centers of Centurion University in association with Talentedge Education Ventures Pvt. Ltd.
- c. The domain name www. cuedu.in will be linked to the main website of Centurion University, i.e., https://cutm.ac.in/
- d. Direct all the students to pay the fees at the time of admission to the payment gateway integrated on the website for online programs
- 3.2 Provide Technology Support Services to Centurion University in all pre-admission and post-admission services to all the students enrolling for Online Programs from India or abroad, under this agreement on the basis of specific requirements of each program as agreed mutually between the parties.
- 3.3 Provide adequate Technology Support Services, through internet marketing, search engine, social media, through offline information centres, and other means, as per agreed guidelines, to Centurion University to promote the programs and solicit students to pursue Programs under this agreement.
- 3.4 Perform all activities as mentioned in this entire agreement only for students who are covered, under in this agreement.



3.5 Will assist the Centurion University through e-learning materials where necessary along with technology support for conduction of

Online Programs in association and approval with Centurion University.

4. Obligations of Centurion University

- 4.1 Will provide to Talentedge Education Ventures Pvt. Ltd. the list of Online Degree Programs offered by Centurion University with applicable fees. This list will contain a detailed curriculum and description of the programs.
- 4.2 Timely approve the content and materials proposed to be used by the Second Party towards the marketing and promotional services to be provided under this Agreement.
- 4.3 Ensure that the terms and conditions under this Agreement and Programs covered under this agreement are in compliance with the rules and regulations in force.
- 4.4 Ensure that it shall not directly or indirectly engage the services of any other service provider for providing the same or similar services for India or outside India.
- 4.5 Will provide to Talentedge Education Ventures Pvt. Ltd. the content of application forms, prospectus, etc., for the programs to be conducted as per the approval of the Centurion University from time to time.
- 4.6 Will provide adequate space at the University premises to select personnel of Talentedge
- 4.7 Shall finalize the examination dates and intimate it to Talentedge Education Ventures Pvt. Ltd. well in advance.
- 4.8 Shall issue identity cards to students who have been admitted /registered for the programs



- 4.9 Shall issue Program Completion Certificate/s and Degrees Certificates as required for the students on successful completion of the programs.
- 4.10 Shall nominate a Responsible Officer / Faculty as a Single Point of Contact.
- 4.11 Shall give advertisements for Online Programs.
- 4.12 Shall conduct examinations, which includes preparation of Question papers, evaluation and declaration of results.

5. General Understanding

5.1 Category : Online Degree Programs

- a. Talentedge would create the website for online programs, initiate digital marketing, student acquisition for said online degree programs
- b. Talentedge would be ready with the platforms like LMS, ERP
- c. Centurion University can assist Talentedge by providing Tutorial Videos recorded from their faculty members, Talentedge would provide the tech support and use the same in courses.
- d. Live Session / Discussion Forum Both Talentedge and University would jointly conduct live sessions and the faculty cost would be borne respectively.

6. Course Administration

All processes involved for the Online Programs, such as selection of candidates, admissions, teaching, examination, evaluation and certification, etc., of the candidates, shall be carried out by Centurion University. Talentedge Education Ventures Pvt. Ltd. would be solely responsible for providing technical support and action of all these activities.

a) Talentedge Education Ventures Pvt. Ltd. will offer technology support in collating and scrutiny of each student admission form for further Venture confirmation of admission to the student of Centurion University b) Online Learning Platform of the University shall be to enroll students via a dedicated user id and password. Talentedge Education Ventures Pvt. Ltd. will provide relevant technology support services.

7. Examination

- 7.1Dates and schedule of Examinations for the programs shall be announced by Centurion University at appropriate time during the semester.
- 7.2Online Remote Proctored examinations would be conducted for the Online Programs.
- 7.3 Talentedge Education Ventures Pvt. Ltd. will provide Technology Support to Centurion University with regard to administrative work pertaining to examination, such as collecting, collating the examination application forms facilitating the students to remit the Examination fees and related actions to Centurion University.
- 7.4For conducting examination through Online mode, Talentedge Education Ventures Pvt. Ltd. is responsible for the online infrastructure as specified by the authorities. University would provide their support in terms of Moderator, Evaluator and creations with validation of question bank.

7.5Exam Fees to be additionally paid by students for every subject.

8. Commercial Terms

All fees mentioned herein and for all revenue share mentioned in all subclauses are applicable for all fees paid by students throughout the tenure of the student at the University for all Semesters and years.

8.1 Bank Account



8.1.1 All fees collected by students at the time of admission and examination and for all future fees paid by the student, would be directed to select payment ways on the new website which would be credited to an escrow bank account. The escrow account will distribute the share to each party and transfer funds immediately as per the pre-defined share to each Party. Payment to Talentedge would be made from the escrow bank account instantly as and when the fees from the student is credited into the escrow account whether for the first time or for subsequent semesters or years. During the collection cycle for both new admissions and reregistration a reconciliation would be done at the end of every month on the application forms generated during the entire admission cycle. During this Monthly reconciliation if there is any payment that is to be made from one party to the other, ie either to the University or to Talentedge, the same would be credited from one party to the other party in the ensuing week post reconciliation

8.2 Course Fees

8.2.1 The course fee along with the Exam fees for each subject has to be paid by the students enrolled as per semester or yearly pattern. The fee sharing for every fees amount collected shall be shared on the ratio of 35%:65% between Centurion University (35%) and Talentedge Education Ventures Pvt. Ltd. (65%). This share is applicable on all students who are enrolled in all programs offered by the Directorate of Online Programs of Centurion University. This would include but not limited to students enrolling through the online marketing efforts of Talentedge Education Ventures Pvt. Ltd., through all the offline or online admission centers that are supporting in the admission of students for all programs of Directorate of Online Programs, and any student who enroll directly to the University either from India or abroad. Talentedge Education Ventures Pvt Ltd also confirms that admission services comprises 65% of the total share received by Talentedge Education Ventures Pvt Ltd.



8.2.2 During the collection cycle for both new admissions fees and installment fees a reconciliation would be done on the first

working day of every month between both parties, on the application forms generated and student fees received during previous month and the entire admission cycle. Based on this monthly reconciliation, the amount payable to Talentedge Education Ventures Pvt Ltd would be paid before the 10th of that month

8.2.3 GST, if applicable would be payable extra, over and over above the said revenue share to Talentedge Education Ventures Pvt Ltd

8.3 Examination Fees

- 8.3.1 For all examinations that are conducted for all programs and students under this agreement, the total examination fee shall be shared on the ratio of 35%:65% between Centurion University (35%) and TALENTEDGE (65%) respectively. GST will be applicable as per the Government Rules and would be extra and over and above the said revenue share to Talentedge
- 8.3.2 Examination fees will be fixed by the University as per norms approved by the competent body of the University, taking into consideration the cost of conducting the examination either on a online or offline mode.

9 Intellectual Property Rights

9.1 The copyright of all the Multimedia course material, provided by and developed by Centurion University, without any support of Talentedge Education Ventures Pvt. Ltd. platform or services will vest exclusively with Centurion University and Talentedge Education Ventures Pvt. Ltd. shall have no right or interest therein whatsoever.



9.2All existing curriculum and content provided by Centurion University would be the copyright of Centurion University.

9.3The copyright of all the Multimedia course material, provided by and developed by Talentedge Education Ventures Pvt. Ltd. platform or services will vest exclusively with Talentedge Education Ventures Pvt. Ltd. and Centurion University shall have no right or interest therein whatsoever.

10 Confidentiality

During the term of this agreement, each party will maintain the confidentiality of the confidential information of the other party and shall not disclose/share such information other than for the purposes of this agreement.

11 Duration and Termination of Agreement

This agreement shall be valid for a period of ten years which would auto extended to further periods of 3 years effective from the date of signing of this agreement. During the period of this Agreement, it is terminable on a minimum of 6 (Six) months notice by either side. However, students admitted prior to the date of notice of termination shall be allowed to complete their program of study and appear in the relevant examinations and the obligations of the respective parties shall continue to be in force during such period, including the extended period, if any, irrespective of termination of the agreement.

12 Force Majeure

If due to 'Force Majeure' like riots, political disturbance, floods, earthquake, endemic or any other natural calamities, or any other similar reason, it becomes advisable or necessary in the agreed opinion of the parties to this agreement to terminate the programs under this agreement, the agreement may be terminated at any time by mutual consent in writing and in cases the parties do not agree, the Agreement may under the said circumstances be terminated by any of the parties by giving 30 days' notice in writing to the other party. Such termination shall be effective in the manner specified in the said notice and shall be without prejudice to the claims which any of the parties may have against the other on the termination of this Agreement in the manner aforesaid. Such Termination shall also be without detriment to the ongoing programs and the enrolled students shall be enabled to complete their programs to avoid hardship and the parties to this agreement shall continue to perform their respective obligations till the completion of ongoing programs.

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13 Amendment To The Agreement

During the operation of the Agreement, if circumstances arise for alteration or modifications of this Agreement, such modifications/alterations can be carried out by mutual discussion and agreement in writing between the parties to this agreement.

14 Indemnification

Centurion University shall indemnify Talentedge Education Ventures Pvt. Ltd. against and hold Talentedge Education Ventures Pvt. Ltd. and its employees and representatives harmless from any claim that may arise from use by Talentedge Education Ventures Pvt. Ltd. of any materials provided by Centurion University to Talentedge Education Ventures Pvt. Ltd. for use in the provision of services for any infringement of a copyright, patent, trademark or other intellectual property rights of any third party. Centurion University confirms to abide by all legal and statutory compliances from all applicable legal authorities, as required in the conduct of the said programs under this Agreement and Centurion University also indemnifies Talentedge Education Ventures Pvt. Ltd. and its employees and representatives harmless from any claim that may arise. The Party seeking to be indemnified shall:

- a. notify the indemnifying Party in writing the details of any allegation claim or loss ("Claim") upon becoming aware of such claim,
- b. make no admission relating to any claims and
- c. allow the indemnifying party to conduct and settle all negotiations and proceedings and give the indemnifying party all reasonable assistance in respect thereof.

In the event that as a result of any suit (i) prior to delivery during the creation, use, operation, sale, offer for sale, distribution or other disposition of any program to be supplied by Centurion University here under is enjoined or (ii) After delivery the creation, use, operation, sale, offer for sale, distribution or other disposition thereof is enjoined Centurion University will at its option and expense either (a) negotiate a license or other agreement with plaintiff so that such item is no longer infringing (b) modify such item suitably or substitute a suitable item therefore which modified or substitute item is not subject to such injunction (provided that such modified or substitute item



shall meet the specification applicable to the original item). And to extend the provision of this article thereto.

15 Miscellaneous Provision

- **15.1** Governing Law: This Agreement shall be construed and enforced in accordance with the law governing such matters in India.
- 15.2 Entire Agreement: This Agreement including the attachments herein mentioned, constitute the entire Agreement of the parties with respect to the subject matter hereof and may not be modified or amended except by a written agreement signed by both Parties
- **15.3** No Waiver: The failure of either party to enforce any of the provision here of shall not be construed to be a waiver of the right of such party therefore to enforce such provision.
- 15.4 Assignment: This Agreement shall ensure to the benefit and be binding upon the Parties here and their successor and assigns provided.
- 15.5 Non-Solicitation: During the term of the Agreement and for a period of one (1) year thereafter, neither Party shall (either directly or indirectly through a third party) employ, solicit to employ, cause to be solicited for the purpose of employment or offer employment to any employee/s or subcontractor/s of the other Party, or aid any third person to do so, without the specific written consent of the other Party.
- **15.6** Publicity: Talentedge Education Ventures Pvt. Ltd. shall be permitted to make reference to Centurion University in its brochures, websites and publicity material relating to the programs being offered in the manners mutually agreed to from time to time.

16. Arbitration and Governing Law



16.1 The Parties expressly agree that any and all controversies or claims and disputes and differences arising out of or in connection with or relating to this Agreement including any questions regarding its interpretations, existence, validity or termination or the breach thereof shall be referred to and be resolved

by or settled by binding arbitration in English ,conducted in accordance with the Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996 and the amendments thereon for the time being in force, which rules are deemed to be incorporated by reference in this clause, and the award made in pursuance thereof shall be final binding on the Parties.

16.2 The arbitrator shall be selected by agreement of the Parties or, if they cannot agree on an arbitrator within thirty (30) days after written notice of a Party's desire to have a matter settled by arbitration, then the arbitrator shall be selected as per the provisions of the Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996. The determination reached in such arbitration shall be final and binding on all Parties hereto without any right of appeal except as provided by the Arbitration & Conciliation Act, 1996 and any amendment of the same from time to time.

16.3 Any court of competent jurisdiction may enforce any determination or award of the arbitrator. The Parties hereby expressly waive any right to trial by jury or class treatment of any claim, demand, action or cause of action arising out of or relating to this Agreement or the breach thereof, provided that nothing in this agreement shall preclude a Party from seeking to compel arbitration in a district or high court of competent jurisdiction. This Agreement shall be interpreted and construed under the laws of India without regard to its conflicts of law principles. The Parties agree to submit to the exclusive jurisdiction of the courts in Mumbai in connection with any dispute arising out of or in connection with this Agreement.





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MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

BETWEEN NMDC LIMITED

AND

ENTURION UNIVERSITY, UNDER CENTURION UNIVERSITY OF TECHNOLOGY & MANAGEMENT (CUTM), KHORDHA, ODISHA

This Memorandum of Agreement (MoA) hereinafter, together with all appendices attached hereto and forming an integral part hereof, called the "Agreement", is made at Khordha, Odisha on this 17th day of September, 2021 between NMDC Limited, a Company under the administrative control of Ministry of Steel, Govt. of India, registered under the Companies Act 1956 and having its registered office at 10-3-311/A, Khanij Bhavan, Masab Tank, Hyderabad-500028 (Telangana), (hereinafter referred to as "NMDC", or the "FIRST PARTY") which expression shall, unless excluded by or repugnant to the context, be deemed to include its successors, administrators, assigns and nominees of FIRST PARTY

AND

Centurion University of Technology & Management (CUTM), Khodha, Odisha, a private University in the state of Odisha and having its Corporate office at 17, Forest Park, Bhubaneswar Dist. Khordha, Odisha-751009 (the Second Party" or "Implementing" Agency"), which expression shall, unless excluded by or repugnant to the context, be deemed to include its successors, administrators, assigns and nominees of CUTM.

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NMDC and **CUTM** shall hereinafter collectively be called "the parties" and individually to as "the party".

AND WHEREAS NMDC as part of its Corporate Social Responsibility has been implementing social welfare activities, which also include skill development training programs for **Socio/economically weaker Sections of the Society**, as part of its effort to support Skill India Mission of the Govt. of India.

AND WHEREAS CUTM vide its proposal submitted in May 2020, followed by details furnished thereon vide letter dated 04.06.2020 & emails dated 12.06.2020, 8.7.2020, & 13.07.2020 has forwarded details w.r.t. proposed initiative for providing Training under Skill Development Programme in Health Sector related skills for benefit of sixty youth from Socio-economically disadvantaged communities around NMDC's Projects in Bastar Division. CUTM Authorities have also requested NMDC for providing financial assistance for implementing the above Skill Development Programme under its CSR initiatives.

NMDC after examination of the proposal vide its letter No.HO/CSR/446 dated 18.02.2021 has communicated its willingness w.r.t. taking up the above based Skill Development programme in Bastar Division for 60 individuals , in the health related skill set with a training cost of total Rs.68,58,900/- (Rupees Sixty Eight Lakh Fifty Eight Thousand Nine Hundred Only).

That the proposal submitted by the CUTM and the communication sent in connection there with, which are annexed here to in the form of Annexures shall also from part of the agreement.

Now, therefore, on the basis of mutual trust and in the spirit of mutual cooperation, NMDC and CUTM are hereby entering into the present Agreement.

NOW IT IS HEREBY AGREED BY AND BETWEEN THE PARTIES HERETO AS UNDER:

1) Objective of the MOA

The objective of this agreement is to jointly contribute to Socio economically disadvantaged communities around NMDC's Projects in Bastar Division through skill development training of certification of six (06) months duration for 30 individuals and 12 months (one year) duration for 30 individuals, in the Health related courses, and thereby improve their employability and livelihood opportunities.

Roles & Responsibilities of CUTM

That the CUTM through its project shall implement the "Skill Development Training program in Health sector related skills, herein after referred to as "Skill Development Programme" which will comprise the following activities:

- a) Training courses with Certification:
 - 1. Duration of 12 Months (One year): OT Technician, Dialysis Technician.
 - 2. Duration of 6 Months Duration: ECG Technician, EEG Technician, EMG Technician, Ward Technician, and Blood collection Technician.

b) Identification & Mobilization of Trainees:

CUTM under this project shall initiate the Skill Development Programme by identification and mobilization of trainees, for the training programme for 6 months and 12 months duration skill set wise and provide the said list to NMDC .NMDC shall be actively involved in the process to ensure selection of candidates by following the principles of 'Son's of Soil' concept by giving preference to candidates belonging to Sc/ST category from surrounding areas of NMDC projects from BPL category by fixing up a criteria. If sufficient local people are not available then candidates from other BPL categories shall be offered selection.

c) Identification, Design & Development of Course curriculum:

Course curriculum shall be as per the norms of CUTM's project and based on the Skill set required to be certified.

d) Arrangement of Accommodation/Boarding:

CUTM shall arrange for Accommodation to the trainees in CUTM's Premises with required norms keeping in view the safety of the Trainees.

e) Arrangement for Providing Uniforms:

CUTM shall arrange for Uniforms to the Sixty (60) Trainees as per the requirement.

f) Skill Development Training Process :

CUTM's Project Authorities shall intimate NMDC the number of batches, trade wise along with number of trainees in each batch; it plans to provide the Skill Development Certification and the status of actual implementation thereof.

g) Assessment & Certification process :

Trainees will be evaluated & certified as per approved CUTM's project norms.

h) Arrangement for Payment of Stipend to the Trainees :

CUTM shall arrange for payment of Stipend as per MSDE norms with Stipend of as specified below:

- 1. Duration of 12 months Trainees : Rs.6000/- with total amount being released in four quarters
- 2. Duration of Six months Trainees: Rs 3000/- with total amount being released in four quarters

i) Placement after completion of Training:

CUTM Project Authorities shall arrange for placement of Trainees after completion of the course as per the Skill under Skill Development Programme. The data shall be provided to NMDC in hard copy format along with claims for release of funds. CUTM shall arrange for placement of at least 70% of the trainees.

j) Management Information System :

CUTM Project Authorities shall arrange for monitoring of the progress of the Skill Development Programme.

k) Signage to NMDC

CUTM's Project shall provide signage to NMDC for the support extended to the project by prominently displaying NMDC's support and accord publicity for the above assistance in all the publications released by it for this project or in the documents where this Project gets mentioned.

Besides this, NMDC shall be invited to the inaugural and valedictory functions of the Skill Development Programme and also be intimated about the commencement and conclusion of each phase of Skill Development Programme. NMDC on its part shall depute its Official(s) or Committee of Officials to attend any of the aforesaid events, as may be convenient, or as may be deemed fit.

2) Roles & Responsibilities of NMDC

That in consideration of the implementation of the above activities NMDC shall make contribution in terms of funds to the extent of Rs.68,58,900/- (Rupees Sixty Eight Lakh Fifty Eight Thousand Nine Hundred Only) in the instalments specified in the table provided hereunder. This amount includes the cost of Training, accommodation, Uniforms, conveyance and certification including cost of pre training transport from Bastar Division to CUTM campus. NMDC does not undertake to release any amount over & above the agreed sum of Rs.68,58,900/- (Rupees Sixty Eight Lakh Fifty Eight Thousand Nine Hundred Lakh Only).

3) That the said agreement will be in terms of funding the implementation of the initiative 2021 for Training program of Skill Development Program and the agreed funds will be released in installments as per the following schedule:

OTHER TERMS & CONDITIONS:

- a) That, CUTM' shall ensure suitable placement to at least 70% of the total trainees upon successful completion of the trainee, immediately after completion thereof. In case of failure to fulfil this clause, Prorata payment calculated with 70% placement being considered 100% attainment of objective will be applied and the same will be adjusted in the fouth (last) instalment. Refer table in clause 3.
- b) That the CUTM shall implement the Skill Development Programme as per the laid down Rules/guidelines, as applicable, obtain all necessary statutory and other approvals/clearances required therefor and abide by all statutory provisions and regulations, connected therewith.
- c) That NMDC does not assume any responsibility in this regard except to the extent of releasing of payments in terms of the provisions agreed upon and incorporated into this Agreement. Further, that NMDC will not be liable to pay any compensation, loss, damages or claims, whatsoever, arising in connection with execution of the aforesaid Skill Development Programme.
- d) NMDC will not incur any recurring expenditure or any further non-recurring expenditure in connection with the implementation of the above Skill Development Program other than the agreed financial support.
- e) That the CUTM shall implement the Skill Development Programme within a timeframe of Twenty four (24) months from the date of signing of this Agreement. However, delay due to situation(s) / condition(s) not under the control of CUTM

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shall exclude from the total Skill Development Programme duration and the said situation shall be intimated to NMDC by the CUTM Authorities.

- f) It is also explicitly agreed that NMDC will not provide any additional assistance beyond the agreed amount of Rs. Rs.68,58,900/- (Rupees Sixty Eight Lakh Fifty Eight Thousand Nine Hundred Only).
- g) In case any amendments are required in any part of the MoA, the Parties on mutual agreement shall incorporate such amendments by way of amendments to this Agreement which shall be binding and be followed by the parties.
- h) Either party may terminate this Agreement by providing the other party with three calendar months advance notice. Such termination shall take effect at the end of the three-month period or the end of the Program's phase in progress at that time, whichever is later. In this eventuality, CUTM shall be liable to refund the un-spent portion of the funds released to it till the date of termination of the Program.
- otherwise terminated by written agreement between the parties, Unless i) or in terms of this Agreement, the Agreement will remain in force for Twenty four (24) months from the date of signing and may be renewed or extended by mutual consent. in writing.

j) Settlement of Disputes:

i (1) The Parties shall use their best efforts to settle amicably any disputes arising out of or in connection with the agreement or the interpretation thereof, if any dispute. difference, question or disagreement arises between the Parties hereto or their respective representatives or assignees, in connection with construction, meaning. operation, effect, interpretation of the Agreement or breach thereof which Parties are unable to settle mutually within 30 days from the commencement of settlement proceedings, the same shall be referred to Arbitration as provided hereunder.

j (2) Arbitration:

- i) All disputes or differences which may arise between the Parties in connection with this MoA (other than those in respect of which the decision of any person is expressed in the MoA to be final and binding) shall, after written notice by either party to the other and to the Chairman cum Managing Director of the NMDC Ltd. (who will be the appointing authority), be referred for adjudication to the sole Arbitrator to be appointed as hereinafter provided.
- ii) The appointing authority will send within ninety days of receipt of the notice of arbitration a panel of three names of persons, not directly connected with the work. to the implementing Agency who will select any one of the persons named to be appointed as a sole Arbitrator within 30 days of receipt of names. If the appointing authority fails to send to the implementing Agency the panel of three names, as aforesaid, within the period specified, the contractor shall send to the appointing authority a panel of three names of persons who shall also be unconnected with the organisation by which the work is executed. The appointing authority shall on receipt of the names as aforesaid select any one of the persons named and appoint him as the sole Arbitrator. If the appointing authority fails to select the person and appoint him as the sole Arbitrator within 30 days of receipt of the panel and inform

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the Contractor accordingly, the Contractor shall be entitled to invoke the provisions of the Indian Arbitration and Conciliation Act 1996 as amended from time to time.

- iii) The laws applicable to this MoA shall be the laws in force in India.
- iv) The Courts of Hyderabad, Telangana State shall have exclusive jurisd iction in all matters arising under this MoA.
- v) The Seat and Venue of the arbitral proceedings shall be Hyderabad, Telangana State, India.
- vi) The Arbitrator shall give reasoned Award and it shall be final and binding on the Parties.
- vii) Parties agree that neither party shall be entitled for any pre-reference or pendentelite interest, i.e. date of cause of action till the date of the Award by the Arbitral Tribunal. Parties agree that claim for any such interest shall not be considered and shall be void. The Arbitral Tribunal shall have no right to award pre-reference or pendente-lite interest in the matter.
- k) That the CUTM agrees to indemnify and keep NMDC indemnified and hold harmless NMDC and their respective CMD, Directors, Officers, Employees, representatives against all civil and criminal liabilities, demands and / or claims whatsoever, including claims for not being in compliance with the provisions of applicable laws, rules, regulations and guidelines, and also against any losses, damages or expenses suffered or incurred that may be suffered or incurred as a result of the nonimplementation of the initiative for any reason whatsoever in relation to this initiative. The CUTM shall be solely responsible for any matter concerning any dispute whatsoever as mentioned above including misdeeds of any kind done in the course of or in connection with the implementation of the initiative.

ARTICLES

Article 1: Areas of Interest

Centurion University of Technology and Management (CUTM), India and Kathmandu University (KU), Nepal agree to explore the possibility of developing collaborative activities which are mutually beneficial.

Cooperation between **CUTM and KU** will be in the areas development and facilitation of joint degree programs; research collaboration in areas of mutual interest; faculty exchange and exchange of students; identification and development of key areas of common interest as stand-alone projects; sponsorship of cooperative seminars, workshops and papers on matters of mutual interest; promoting programs offered by the institutes to their existing students.

The Areas of Cooperation are open to modification or expansion after mutual discussion and agreement.

Article 2: Activities and Cooperation

- 1. Development and Facilitation of Joint Degree Programs
 - **1.1. CUTM** and **KU** will collaborate for developing and executing joint degree Programs.
 - **1.2. CUTM** and **KU** will work together in development of syllabus, admission, placement and evaluation process for the said program.





1.3. CUTM and KU will work together for delivery of the program. Students admitted to the program will spend one/two semester (s) at CUTM.

2. Facilitation of Degree Programs at Undergraduate and Post-graduate Level

- **2.1 CUTM** and **KU** will facilitate entry to bachelor and master programs of each institute.
- **2.2 CUTM and KU** agree to welcome appropriately qualified students from respective institutions who meet the admission criteria of host institute onto the relevant degree schemes.
- **2.3 CUTM** can facilitate the project internships for the students of Undergraduate and Post graduate programmes through its own enterprises/ units.

3. Faculty Exchange Program

- **3.1** Both Institutions may exchange academic faculty and staff for purposes of teaching, conducting or organizing seminars on topics of mutual interest, and collaborating on individual or joint research programs and project works for sharing knowledge.
- **3.2** Each Institution will determine the number of Exchange Faculty each academic year through communication and mutual agreement based on the availability of openings and the number of qualified faculty members interested to participate in the program.
- **3.3** Any individual agreement reached will be appended to this agreement. Each university, or the individual staff concerned, will be responsible for the travel, housing, and other expenses of its own faculty. The Host Institution will assist in locating suitable accommodation for incoming guest faculty whenever possible.
- **3.4** No later than ninety (90) days before the start of each academic year, the Host Institution will present a list of faculty members nominated for participation in the Program for the upcoming academic year. The Host Institution reserves the right to approve such faculty. The parties will confirm the final list of Exchange Faculty no later than 60 days before the start of the academic year.
- **3.5** Exchange Faculty will be fully qualified in all respects according to the standards of the Home Institution.
- **3.6** Exchange Faculty will be employees of the Home Institution, and will be compensated by the Home Institution. In no event shall the Exchange Faculty be considered agents, employees or representatives of the Host Institution.
- **3.7** The Home Institution will submit faculty credentials to the Host Institution prior to the beginning of each exchange.





- **3.8** Exchange Faculty will be subject to the policies, rules and regulations of the Host Institution.
- **3.9** The Host Institution agrees to make accommodation and transportation and emergency medical services available to each Exchange Faculty. Any costs for such services will be borne by the Exchange Faculty receiving such services.

4. Student Exchange Program

- **4.1** Students of each Institutions will be encouraged to participate in Study Programs, Trainings and Seminars, Summer Workshop Programs, and other Student Activities to promote international friendship and world peace by stimulating and supporting intercultural activities and projects between Post-Graduate Students from **India and Nepal.**
- **4.2** Each Institution, conforming to the admission requirements of the Host Institution, shall assume full responsibility in the assessment and selection of qualified candidates. The Host Institution shall then respect the selection so made. The selection process shall consist of stringent evaluation of the student's previous academic record, drive, motivation, and overall potential to succeed in an international academic environment.
- **4.3** In case of student exchange from one institution to another, the fee structure (including tuition fee and miscellaneous fee) of the academic year will be applicable. The student can go for exchange program from One (1) Semester to Two (2) Semesters Maximum.
- **4.4** Both parties agree to share 10% of the tuition fee as revenue in case of student exchange program from either party. This is based on the institution fee structure. Student will pay the Semester Tuition & Miscellaneous Fees as per the institutions published fee structure. Any additional cost on accommodation, visa, transportation etc. shall be borne by the student. There should be no claims on percentage sharing which usually becomes confusing and cumbersome/
- **4.5** Each institution assures that students have the language proficiency necessary to fulfil their academic plan, i.e. the medium of instruction to be English for the previously acquired degree.
- **4.6** While at the Host Institution, students will take courses in subjects similar to those required at their Home Institution. The exact program of each student will be determined by the student with the approval of his/her supervisors at the home institution and at the Host Institution.
- **4.7** Students from either Institution, when applying for admission under the program, will adhere to the admission of the Host Institution. Student selection will be based on meeting the requirements of the courses or programs applied for.





- **4.8** Both Institutions will require for exchange students include, but not limited to, the applicant's academic transcript and a recommendation letter from the Supervisor and other requirements as stipulated by each institution.
- **4.9** All exchange students shall be subject to the same academic regulations regarding class performance as pertaining to regularly enrolled students, at the receiving institution. All exchange students shall, within reasonable limits, attempt to represent their Home Institution and country to the best of their ability.
- **4.10** Both Institutions will assist incoming students to find suitable accommodation during their stay. Students will be required to stay in University Hostel or Accommodation prescribed by the University. Additional Fees for hostel shall apply.
- **4.11** Students enrolled in the Host Institution will be subject to the same rules and regulations as local students. Students will be eligible for all the services and rights normally provided to locally enrolled students.
- **4.12** Violation of local laws committed in the host country shall subject the exchange student to immediate withdrawal of his/her academic sponsorship and to immediate termination of the program. Such termination may also negatively affect the student's immigration status.
- **4.13** The academic record of each student's academic performance shall be sent directly to his/her Home Institution at the conclusion of each semester. Any academic credit earned at the Host Institution may be transferred back to the Home Institution in accordance with procedures determined by the Home Institution.

5. Research Collaboration

This Collaborative Partnership is defining the collective and individual responsibilities of the Institution in the areas of Research, Joint Hosting and Organization of Seminars, Conferences and Workshops, and any other academic activities related to the programs mentioned in Article 1 of this agreement, will be encouraged.

6. Conferences

Invitation to attend any conferences hosted by either institution at discounted prices.

Article 3: University Services

Visiting faculty or students will have access to the same basic services and facilities normally received by faculty and students at the Host Institution including the following:

- a. Classroom facilities
- b. Library Facilities





- c. Web Access
- d. Computer Laboratories
- e. Multi Purpose Hall
- f. Conference Room
- g. Hostel facilities
- h. Any Other Convenience that would support and strengthen cooperative activities.

Article 4: Financial Arrangements

Any financial arrangement not already stated in the articles above, will be discussed and ' agreed upon, on a case-by-case basis by both universities, until a mutually acceptable framework is set-up before an academic activity, or faculty or student exchange takes place.

Article 5: Modifications and Validity

- **5.1** Modifications, if necessary, can be made in writing with a notice period of three (3) months, after mutual agreement. Such modifications will be appended to this agreement.
- 5.2 Either party may terminate the Memorandum of Understanding with three (3) months written notification sent by courier or email. In case of termination, the date of written notice or date of termination will not affect the activities already in progress. These will continue unhindered until concluded in accordance with the agreement under which they were initiated. This includes the financial and/or any other arrangements agreed upon at the beginning of the activity.
- **5.3** This Memorandum of Understanding becomes valid on the date of signature by both parties and remains valid for five (5) years, renewed automatically unless one party informs the other party of non-renewal in writing.

Preamble

1. Indian Navy (First Party). In support of India's growing security needs and responsibilities, the Indian Navy (*IN*) has the vision to create and sustain a three dimensional technology enabled and networked Blue Water Navy for safeguarding India's Maritime interests and being the preferred 'Security Partner' in Indian Ocean Region. The *IN* recognizes the central role of Indian Colleges/Institutions/universities in development of futuristic technology and is also committed to innovation and indigenisation.

2. Centurion University of Technology & Management, Odisha (Second Party). Colleges/ Institutions/ Universities are in a unique position to develop futuristic combat technology by harnessing talent available within the campus. Centurion University of Technology & Management, Odisha, a research and educational institution in science, technology and engineering disciplines established by a special act of parliament of Republic of India/ Private entity and having its office at Bhubaneswar, herein after referred as "Centurion", Bbsr, which expression, unless repungent to the context shall mean and include its successors and assigns of the second party.

Purpose

3. With a view to encourage defense manufacturing, indigenisation and innovation in the country in keeping with the Government's articulated vision of *ATMANIRBHAR BHARAT* and 'Make in India', *IN* and "Centurion", Bbsr (hereafter referred to jointly as "parties" and individually as 'party') enter into this Memorandum of Understanding (MoU).

4. The parties shall jointly work to promote culture of innovation and research in futuristic combat technologies pertaining to defence. The fields shall include, but not be limited to, Underwater weapon & sensors, Missiles, Guns, Ammunition, Radar, Hyper Velocity Projectiles, Unmanned Aerial/Underwater Surface Vehicle, Combat Management System, Geospatial science, decision support etc to develop and enhance fighting capabilities of *IN*.

Jurisdiction

5. This MoU is subject at all times to Indian Laws, Rules and Regulations. Disputes, if any, will be settled through mutual discussions between the parties.

Scope

<u>Article 1:</u> <u>Point of Contact</u>. Both parties shall nominate suitable Point of Contact (PoC) for the implementation of this MoU. The respective PoC shall maintain close coordination with one another and work towards meeting the objectives of this collaboration as outlined in this MoU.

Article 2: IN shall designate "Centurion", Bbsr, as Indian Naval Students Engagement Program (IN STEP) Knowledge Partner.

Article 3: "Centurion", Bbsr shall promote culture of innovation and research in futuristic combat technologies to develop and enhance fighting capabilities of *IN*. Towards this, Colleges/Institutions/Universities will periodically provide the *IN* with research proposals from students for undertaking five month on-line unpaid internship under Indian Naval Students Engagement Programme (IN STEP). The detailed guidelines for on-line internship for students would be worked out mutually by both the PoC.

Article 4: *IN* shall consider extension of certain selected promising proposals post completion of five month on-line internship. A contract program with access to naval facilities and interaction with naval domain experts for better understanding of the problem statement(s) and familiarization with the context of the research subject shall be facilitated by *IN* for such selected proposals.

Article 5. *IN* shall award a 'Certificate of Participation' to all participating students on completion of satisfactory participation on the internship, subject to the quality of the dissertation.

<u>Article 6.</u> "Centurion", Bbsr will nominate a suitable Professor as a guide to provide requisite guidance to the participating students. The final dissertation shall be examined by the *IN*, in consultation with designated guide. Dissertations may be examined by external faculty subject matter specialist of the concerned field, if required.

Article 7. <u>Confidentiality</u>. Most information exchanged under this MoU would not be of CLASSIFIED nature. However, some information may be considered proprietary and/or commercially sensitive. During the tenure of MoU both *IN* and Centurion Bbsr will maintain required confidentiality and prevent any disclosure of any such information and data exchanged under the scope of the MoU for any purpose other than in accordance with this MoU and after written consent of the parties. Sharing of any CLASSIFIED information by the *IN*, if undertaken, would be under the extant Government regulations.

<u>Article 8.</u> Effective Data and Duration of MoU. This MoU will come into effect from the date on which both parties have signed the MoU and will remain in force for an initial period of three years from then onwards. This MoU may be terminated by the either of the parities with a written notice of 3 months to the other party. In case of termination of MoU, all activities undertaken on its basis shall be fully implemented under the same conditions as they have been started.

Article 9. Both the parties may mutually modify this MoU as may be required from time to time.

It is hereby settled and mutually agreed by and between the parties hereto as under:

 To support the Diploma/ Bachelor/ Master in Pharmacy, BSc and MSc Forensic Sciences, MSc in Cyber Security courses from the academic session 2021-22 in CUTM, Bhubaneswar as per the approved norms of PCI/AICTE & UGC. in this regard, based on the course curriculum, syllabus and regulations as approved by the Board of Studies/ Academic Council/ Board of Governors of CUTM, as per the responsibility chart agreed upon by parties of the first part and second part.

2. REVISED PERIOD OF MOU

The earlier MOU which was valid for a period of 10 years (Ten Years, which was entered on 8th day of October 2015 at Bhubaneswar as the date of signing the MOU) by the parties hereto, following review (2021), the MOU is hereby modified on the mutually agreed terms and conditions of both

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the parties for the balance period of 4 years approximately (by 8th October 2025) which will come into force from 1st July 2021.

3. RESPONSIBILITY OF THE FIRST PARTY

- a) To physically carry out the courses as per the approved (by Board of Studies/ Academic Council/ Board of Governors of CUTM) syllabus and course curriculum bases on PCI/ AICTE/ UGC norms.
- b) To appoint as per the norms of CUTM and make payments to the faculty and other supporting staff.
- c) To develop and maintain the laboratories, other equipment, hardware, software, etc. which are not available at university but may be required from time to time for smooth conduct of the courses.
- d) Take care of admission of the students, publicity, promotion, advertisements etc. for these courses.
- e) To assist for field study and in-house industrial training etc. wherever necessary.
- f) To pay for telephone, internet and electricity services and other consumables for these courses.
- g) To provide the facility for the Library Books for these courses as well as for new courses.

4. RESPONSIBILITY OF THE SECOND PARTY

- a) To completely be accountable and take responsibility for the regulatory work required for Pharmacy courses and also responsible for the academic audit by AICTE & PCI from time to time.
- b) To liaise (internal and external) with various partners or organizations in the delivery of Forensic Science courses.
- c) To assist the party of the 1st part in determining the lab, consumables and books required for existing and future batches.
- d) To be responsible for the academic administration of all the schools of Pharmacy(s) and the School of Forensic Science across campuses for monitoring the day to day operations like timely delivering of all academic schedules, participation in all online Dean's / All Faculty meetings / FDP's / Research / IQAC meetings and CSR events, compliance to processes and schedules, full participation in all the activities initiated by the University.
- e) Also, be responsible to assist in screening and being a part of the panel for identifying resources, faculty recruitment and competency mapping for the school as and when required.

5. JOINT RESPONSIBILITY

a) In case of non-renewal of MOU or discontinuance of the course(s), both parties will discharge their responsibilities as per the MOU till the completion of the course of all the students already admitted in this MOU period.

6. COURSE CAPACITY

It will be as mutually agreed upon between the first party and the second party, based on the norms of PCI/UGC.

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7. COMMERCIAL TERMS

For the responsibilities outlined Heritage Trust will get a management fee of 15% of the academic fees to be released on a quarterly basis (as against the revenue collected from the students for the following programs: B Pharm, D Pharm, BSc Forensic Science, MSc Forensic Science and Cyber Security, MBA in Pharmaceutical Management).

8. COURSE PROMOTION

- a) Course promotion will be done by Party one with due academic and other support from party two.
- b) Neither party shall assign their MOU to any other party/person(s).

9. GENERAL TERMS OF REFERENCES

- a) Mahesh Patnaik, Trustee-in-Chief, Heritage Trust to be appointed as pro-bono Director Administration responsible for the School of Pharmacy and Life Science and School of Forensic Sciences for campuses where it is applicable.
- Expenses towards the AICTE & PCI if any required to be incurred further (apart from the existing University approvals in place) shall have to be borne by the party of the 2nd part.

10. CONFLICT OF INTEREST

- a) During the term of this Agreement, the Second party will not undertake or cause to undertake any action that will undermine the interest, image and goodwill of CUTM.
- b) The Second Party will notify CUTM of any possible or potential conflict of interest which may result from its activities, and shall commence such activities only after written approval of the University, which may not be unreasonably withheld.

11. TERMINATION

In the event of breach of terms and conditions in this MOU as enumerated herein above being committed by any of the parties hereto, the aggrieved party may issue a notice by registered post with AD to the other party calling upon it to rectify such default or breach within 3 (three) months after receipt of such notice and in the event the other party does not rectify the default or breach as described in the aforesaid notice within the stipulated period, the aggrieved party may issue notice for termination of the MOU which shall take effect from 3 (three) months after receipt of such 2nd notice. However, a suitable lead time shall be allowed for completion of a batch. Hence, any such termination can only put into effect after completion of 3 (Three) years.

12. JURISDICATION AND ARBITRATION

In the event of any dispute between the parties hereto the following procedure shall be adopted to resolve differences.

This Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) is made on this 28th day of January, 2017 at Visakhapatnam, Andhra Pradesh, during the Andhra Pradesh Partnership Summit 2017, by and between Centurion University and the Government of Andhra Pradesh (GoAP), for establishing the Centurion University in Andhra Pradesh.

The State of Andhra Pradesh has enacted the landmark the Andhra Pradesh **Private Universities (Establishment and Regulation) Act, 2016** with the objective of inviting private investments to provide high quality, research oriented and industry relevant higher education of international standards in the State.

The Sponsoring Body of Centurion University submitted a proposal and Detailed Project Report (DPR) to Government of Andhra Pradesh to establish a Greenfield Private University, and subsequently a Letter of Intent (LoI) was issued to the University by Government of Andhra Pradesh.

- 1. As per the DPR submitted by the Sponsoring Body and Lol issued by the GoAP, the Sponsoring Body has committed to **direct investment in Andhra Pradesh of Rs. 136.32 Crores over 10 years**; a student strength of 14,000 by the 10th year of its operations; and to commence its operations from the academic year 2017-18.
- 2. The Sponsoring Body shall also fulfill the following objectives:
 - a) To provide for instruction, teaching, leaning and training in the University in the field of higher education and make provisions for research, advancement and dissemination of knowledge;
 - b) To establish and maintain a campus with international standards of education;





- c) To create and maintain centers of excellence, for research and development and for sharing knowledge and its applications;
- d) To encourage and use the latest technology for education, research and training;
- e) To develop state-of-art facilities for education, research and training;
- f) To establish educational programmes for diplomas, degrees and postgraduate courses, doctoral degrees and postdoctoral programmes;
- g) To collaborate with national and global institutions for offering programmes and creating capabilities for upgrading programmes;
- h) To confer degrees, diplomas and other academic distinctions on the basis of an approved method as established by the academic council of the University;
- To ensure that the standards of the degrees, diplomas and other academic distinctions are higher than those laid down by the regulatory bodies;
- j) To establish appropriate linkages with industry and society so that the programmes so offered are relevant to industry and society at large.
- 3. The Government of Andhra Pradesh will facilitate the establishment of Andhra Pradesh as per the provisions of the Act.
- 4. The Sponsoring Body shall be bound by its commitments in the DPR, all conditions in the Andhra Pradesh Private Universities (Establishment and Regulation) Act, 2016 (Act No.3 of 2016) and the rules framed thereunder.

This MoU is an expression of intent and is not legally binding.

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- 1. That the both parties agreed to the scope of this agreement for effective implementation of the project as per the laid down terms and conditions.
- 2. That, both the parties agreed to implement the project whose details are given in Annexure-1.

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The parties, having discussed fields of common research interests and allied activities between the two institutions, have decided to enter into long-term collaboration for promotion of students' training and quality postgraduate research in cutting edge areas in accordance with the provisions contained in the Guidelines issued vide Letter No. 2-8/2012-HRD dated 11th December, 2012 or as revised from time to time.

WHEREAS the "First Party" is involved in the studies on Agricultural Water Management (specific mandated domain within the approved disciplines/divisions), AND WHEREAS the "Second Party", established with reference to Odisha State Government notification no. 9609/I-Legis-21/2010 dated 27th August 2010, vide Act No.4 of 2010 of State Legislature of Odisha as a State Private University and vide F. No.8-28/2010(CPP-I/PU) dated 18.01.2011 by UNIVERSITY GRANTS COMMISSION, NEW DELHI is involved in Teaching, Research and Extension of Under Graduate and Post Graduate studies in the field of agriculture and allied Sciences (specific areas of research), AND WHEREAS it has been considered expedient to agree in writing to participate jointly in the projects requiring expertise and logistics from both the parties.

Article 1. Scope

- 1.1 The Second party will recognize the First party as an Institute for conducting research related to the thesis requirement of the research students for PG and Ph.D. Programme. The Second party will recognize Scientists of the ICAR Institute as recommended by its Director in accordance with the University rules and regulations for guiding students working for the said degree.
- 1.2 Operational details of research effort and collaboration will be made in common research programmes and/or projects restricted to specific mandated domain within the approved disciplines/divisions. The objective(s) for research work for a student coming from a Second party outside NARS should be exclusively different as far as possible.
- 1.3 Research instrumentation facility and library facilities available with the First party and the Second party will be made available to the faculty and research scholars. However, the costs of specific consumables will be borne by the respective organizations.
- 1.4 There shall be an exchange of students for academic, research and training purposes. Accommodation in the Hostel shall be arranged, wherever possible, as per extant rates. The duration of exchange visits will be determined by mutual consent between both the parties.
- 1.5 The second party will recognize the First party as an Institute for capacity building of students and farmers, which will be undertaken by 2nd party as per ICAR rules and guidelines for professional service functions (Training, consultancy, contract research and contract service, 2014) or any further guidelines from ICAR from time to time.

Article 2. Management

- 2.1 Director of the First party and the Vice-Chancellor/Head of the Institution of the Second party will be responsible to work out operational details of co-operation between the two organizations and ensure proper and effective implementation of this MoU.
- 2.2 The Advisory Committee will meet at least once in a year alternatively in the institutions of the First party and the Second party to review the activities. This meeting shall include presentation on the academic and research activities, which should be open to the students, faculty and scientists.

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Article 3. Exchange of Information

- 3.1. The term "information" includes scientific or technical data, results and/or methods of investigation, and other information intended to be provided, exchanged, or arising under project descriptions entered into pursuant to this MoU.
- 3.2. The parties support the widest possible dissemination of information. Each party in joint projects shall be given the right to use, disclose, publish or disseminate such information for any and all purposes.

Article 4. General Provisions

- 4.1 It is understood that the First party and the Second party subscribe to the principle of equal opportunity and do not discriminate on the basis of race, sex, age, caste or religion. Both the Institutions shall abide by these principles in the administration of this agreement and neither party shall impose criteria for exchange of scholars or students, which violate principles of non-discrimination.
- 4.2 Both parties understand that all financial agreements will have to be negotiated separately and will depend on the availability of funds.
- 4.3 Both parties acknowledge that exchange of students from one party to the other shall be subject to the availability of funds and shall comply with the regulations and policies of the First party and the Second party.
- 4.4 Any research publications arising will be jointly published in accordance with the provisions laid out in Item 3.2.1C of the Guidelines for the students to conduct research for their degree programme as trainees at ICAR institutions as notified vide Letter No. 2-8/2012-HRD dated 11th December, 2012 or revised guidelines, if any, as may be issued from time to time.
- 4.5 A copy of the thesis/dissertation will be submitted to the First Party after the award of the degree by the Second party.
- 4.6 All questions related to this MoU arising during its term will be settled by the parties by mutual agreement. Disagreements at the operating level shall be forwarded to respective higher officials for appropriate resolution failing which an arbitrator of mutual acceptance may be identified for the settlement of dispute, if any.
- 4.7 All questions not foreseen related to this MoU will be handled by the parties by mutual agreement.
- 4.8 Nothing in this MoU is intended to affect other cooperation or collaborations between the parties.

Article 5. Intellectual Property Rights

5.1 The Second party will be expected to ensure protection of the Intellectual Property Rights generated or likely to be generated during the student's research work. The ICAR as the first applicant (for its institute) and the Second party shall be the joint applicants for IPRs and the students and involved scientific staff shall be included as the inventor/breeder/author. The 'ICAR Guidelines for Intellectual Property Management and Technology Transfer/Commercialization' as amended from time to time shall be the reference for exploitation of the generated intellectual property, whose management and benefits sharing shall be mutually decided in each case.

Article 6. Admission and Fees

- 6.1 All those who wish to register as trainees or for Master/Doctoral programme under this MoU must apply for admission at the Second party. The allocation of Major Guide/Advisor would be finalized before the registration and will be governed by the provisions laid out in Items 3.2.1A and 3.2.2A of the Guidelines for the students to conduct research for their degree programmes as trainees at ICAR institutions as notified vide Letter No. 2-8/2012-HRD dated 11th December, 2012 or revised Guidelines, if any, as may be issued from time to time, for the students from within NARS and outside NARS, respectively.
- 6.2 Admission of the students and the award of degrees for different programmes will be the responsibility of the Second party as per the rules and regulations.
- 6.3 Allotment of the students at the First party will be done by the approval of Director of the First party and Vice-Chancellor/Head of the Institution of the Second party.
- 6.4 The First party would have the right to screen the student's eligibility for admission based on their academic period.
- 6.5 The PME Cell of the First party in consultation with the representative of the Second party shall decide the location and sharing quantum of research work.
- 6.6 The number of student(s) at any particular time will be subjected to the availability of research facilities and scientists' time to guide thesis research at the First party institution.
- 6.7 Any student(s) admitted to the First party for training/postgraduate research, if found violating the rules and regulations laid down by the First party or indulge in such activities that amount to tarnishing the image of the Institute, or cause damage to the property, the registration of such student(s) would be summarily terminated. The Second party will not complete the formalities of issuing the certificates to such students until they compensate the losses to the First party.
- 6.8 Fees will be charged from the students by the First party as per Guidelines for the students to conduct research for their degree programmes as trainees at ICAR institutions vide Letter No. 2-8/2012-HRD dated 11thDecember, 2012 (*) or revised Guidelines, if any, as may be issued from time to time. No fee may be charged by the First party from the students registered with AU/DU within NARS. However a student registered with a Second party, outside NARS, will deposit fee of Rs.10,000 for training duration up to 3 months (not leading to a degree/dissertation) and Rs.30,000 per semester (six months) for training, research, dissertation exceeding three months. Any change in fee structure by ICAR will be applicable from the date of revision and shall be charged by the First party.

Article 7. Entry into effect, modification and termination

7.1. This MoU shall become effective on the date it is signed by the parties and shall be valid for three years extendable up to five years. Both parties shall review the status of the MoU at the end of each three/five year period to determine any modification, whenever necessary. The period of validity of this MoU may be extended by mutual consent up to five years. This MoU may be amended by mutual written agreement and may be terminated at any time by either party upon written notification signed by the competent authority of the party initiating termination. Such notification must be given to the other party at least six months in advance from the effective date of termination.

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- 7.2. All joint activities not completed at the expiration or termination of the MoU may be continued until their completion under the terms of this MoU.

The modifications/changes shall become part of the MoU and shall be effective from the date on which they are made/executed, unless otherwise agreed to.

MANIPAL HEALTH ENTERPRISES PRIVATE LIMITED, a company incorporated under the Indian Companies Act, 1956 and having its principal place of business at 98/2 Rustom Bagh Road Off HAL Airport Road, Kodihalli, Bengaluru, Karnataka 560017, India, (hereinafter referred to as the "MANIPALHOSPITALS" /MHEPL" which term or expression as herein used shall mean and include its successors, and assigns where the context so requires or admits) of the OTHER PART.

1. RECITALS

Whereas

A. CENTURION is conducting various courses besides vocational education and training and is a UGC notified & NAAC A Grade accredited University. Centurion University has been declared as a Skills University of Odisha by Govt. of Odisha in 2017 and has been selected as a NEEM Facilitator by AICTE for implementing work integrated training programs resulting in a University qualification.

B. GTET as an entrepreneurial outreach of Centurion University setup in partner with National Skill Development Corporation. GTET is engaged, inter alia, in skill development of youth across multiple states of India with approvals from Govt. of India and state governments of Odisha, Assam, AP, Telangana, Chhattisgarh, Jharkhand, Himachal Pradesh, Rajasthan & Punjab and works closely with industry partners to provide employment opportunities to youth with organizations like Ashok Leyland, Volvo Eicher, Yamaha, Café Coffee Day, Eicher Tractors, Hyundai, Godrej & Boyce etc. GTET manages and implements all programs under CUTM's School of Vocational Education & Training.

C. Manipal Hospitals is one of the largest healthcare brands in India. It is present in 7 Indian cities and has an international presence through two locations in Klang, Malaysia and Lagos, Nigeria. One of the leading hospitals in India, it offers treatment and facilities across a wide range of specialties, including Cardiac Care, Renal Sciences, Cancer Care, Organ Transplants and many others.

The aforementioned parties for mutual benefit wish to enter into an agreement to identify, skill & deploy skilled paramedical and allied healthcare sciences professionals across various states for employment through this strategic long term collaboration.

During the term of this Agreement, Centurion -Gram Tarang and Manipal Hospitals shall continue to review their relationship and take in good faith all actions to strengthen the association and promote their mutual interest. The co-operation of the parties is for the purpose of complementing their respective resources capabilities in pursuance of establishing projects / initiatives.

2. Regulatory Permissions

All the proposed courses are developed under NATIONAL SKILLS QUALIFICATIONS FRAMEWORK (NSQF) which is a competency-based framework that organizes all qualifications according to a series of levels of knowledge, skills and aptitude and is governed by National Skill Development Agency,

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Ministry of Skill Development & Entrepreneurship, Govt. of India. Subsequent guidelines have been issued by UGC & AICTE for aligning qualifications to the education system and Centurion-Gram Tarang courses are all designed within the NSQF Framework including Vocational Diploma & Degree level programs and has UGC approval under the DDU Kaushal Kendra scheme vide e-notification nr 5375293 to offer Diploma, Advanced Diploma & B.Voc. degrees in partnership with the industry.

Following are the regulatory permissions which allow the parties to take up such a program:

Representation

- Manipal Hospitals is one of the largest healthcare brands in India. It is present in 7 Indian cities. Manipal Hospitals aim to provide a wide variety of preventive and curative solutions to your health problems and needs skilled paramedic professionals across it various operating locations.
- Centurion University is a UGC notified, NAAC A grade accredited Skills University and through its outreach, Gram Tarang, is a partner of National Skill Development Corporation and all its courses are aligned to the National Skills Qualifications Framework and are compliant with relevant sector skill council Qualification Packs & National Occupational Standards thus bringing them under the purview of the National Skill Mission.
- Centurion University has also received permission from AICTE vide reference number F.No. 1-3422061411/NEEM/GTETSPL/2017 dated 22nd November 2017 to offer on the job practical training to enhance the employability of youth while they continue working or internship with the industry.
- Centurion- Gram Tarang has also received permissions vide Letter No. MSDE-19/03/2015-CD dated 18.8.2015 from the Directorate General of Training ("DGT") of the Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship ("MSDE"), Government of India to implement high employment potential courses for specific needs of Industries through a Flexi MoU. Centurion-Gram Tarang has also signed a separate MoU to function as Third-Party Aggregator (TPA) and engage apprentices on behalf of industry partners under the Apprenticeship Act 1961.

3. Objective of agreement & Operating Model

CENTURION-GRAM TARANG is willing to partner with Manipal Hospitals in order to mobilize, train & deploy youth to work as Skilled Hospital Staff across various Manipal Hospitals located in India or any affiliated health centers and diagnostic centers.

The purpose of the agreement is to provide internship training as apart of their curriculum with Centurion Gram Tarang

OPERATING MODEL:

a) Students Selection: 12th pass / Diploma pass / Graduates / Post graduates as applicable as the minimum requirement of the course. would be mobilized by Centurion-Gram Tarang after applying screening /selection criteria

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- b) Courses & Training Duration will be defined complying with norms as defined by University norms, required Paramedical board & HSSC norms. An indicative list of long term courses is provided in annexure(I).
- c) Training Curricula will satisfy norms by Paramedical Board and/or HSSC and/or any board that might be required in future. The curricula can be modified to include additional requirements that may be required including but not limited to curricula pertaining to paramedics and allied health sciences. Additional requirements could in areas of customer centricity, soft skills, communication, Billing and ordering systems, Manipal Hospitals internal processes and standard operating procedures viz. Manipal Hospitals's HIS, Infection control practices and other areas of skill training as required.
- d) Residential Training will be undertaken at Centurion-Gram Tarang's training centers followed by deployment to Manipal Hospitals locations for pursuing the Internship Training as a part of the corresponding course.
- e) Internship will be done at the Manipal Hospitals location in Bangalore under supervision of all parties and duration of such training would be based on mutual agreement and would be a part of the curriculum offered byCenturion-Gram Tarang
- f) The locations for deployment will be determined by the Manipal Hospitals and will be communicated to Centurion-Gram Tarang in a periodic manner.
- g) Contact classes for the course will be facilitated by Centurion-Gram Tarang at its centers but part of the course may be offered at the Manipal Hospitals premises or in an appropriate training center near the work location of trainees. If required, training dedicated Manipal Hospitals specific curriculum can also be delivered with the help of Manipals Hospitals team of healthcare staff;
- h) Stipend: Agreed monthly stipend as per the policy of Manipal Hospitals will be remitted to the student-trainee during his internship period by Manipal Hospitals with agreed deductions for training fee and /or hostel, food, uniform as applicable and mutually agreed..
- i) Training & Service fee retained from the trainee, if any will be passed through to Centurion-Gram Tarang for delivery of training & management of the program as per detailed commercial agreement.
- j) Certification : On successful completion of the OJT internship period and clearing the examination conducted by Centurion-Gram Tarang, the trainee will receive certifications from Centurion University. This may be supplemented by an additional certification of the Healthcare Sector Skill Council in due course.
- k) Placement of Trainees after completion of the 6 months Internship to the satisfaction of Manipal Hospitals and subject to meeting Manipal Hospital determined eligibility criteria of providing necessary certificates supporting successful passing of the course and being medically fit may consider providing employment to the Trainees subject to availability of vacancies.
- I) In an event, Manipal Hospital is unable to provide employment to the Internship Trainees, Centurion-Gram Tarang will explore other employment opportunities for the Trainees
- m) Monitoring, reporting: Manipal Hospitals will be monitoring regular progress of the student through periodic attendance tracking, assessments & documentation of on the job learning. Specific Assessments required by Manipal Hospitals would be facilitated by Centurion-Gram Tarang

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4 Responsibilities:

Centurion- Gram Tarang

- a) Assist in identification of Student-Trainees who will meet the required criteria of courses for undergoing Internship Training with Manipal Hospitals. Such requirements would be agreed at the beginning of each course and batch and can be modified on a periodic basis.
- Developing curriculum & syllabus in consultation with Manipal Hospital for the underlying qualification which will be offered to the Trainees
- c) Training delivery during basic training including curriculum, content, trainers, visiting faculty & cost of consumables Quality control of training (assessment, reviews, suspension/ expulsion of Student-Trainees not meeting the requirement)
- d) Assessment, certification after completion of the course
- e) Administration with respect to the training
- f) Monitoring & tracking of program with submission of regular reports on monthly basis.
- g) Centurion-Gram Tarang shall take care of the Travel, food and accommodation requirements of the Trainees during the period of Internship Training and the cost of same shall not be charged to Manipal Hospitals
- h) Centurion-Gram Tarang shall communicate to the Trainees that those who are absorbed by Manipal Hospitals post internship training shall be responsible to take care of their accommodation, travel and food expenses themselves and Manipal Hospitals shall not be liable for the same

5. Responsibilities: Manipal Hospital

- a) Manipal Hospital would provide access to hospitals for a thorough study of internal process and procedures as might be required for incorporation into curricula
- b) Manipal Hospital would provide support for training of trainers through provision of Manipal staff deputed at Centurion-Gram Tarang locations for training delivery method as per standards of the company. Manipal Hospital would provide support for Centurion-Gram Tarang faculty to attend trainings and workshops or facilitate short term orientation to understand the hospitals culture and processes.
- c) The Manipal Hospital facility located in Bangalore, would act as HUB for on the job trainings and internships as required by Manipal Hospital norms for attaining required experience for employment as full time staff. Manipal would provide support in terms of content and specific teaching staff for any customization of the available curricula as agreed from time to time.
- d) Monitoring, attendance tracking & Sharing student-trainee attendance records & performance feedback with Centurion-Gram Tarang on a monthly basis in a pre-agreed format.

6 Joint responsibilities

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The 2 parties will be jointly responsible for:

- a) Appointing respective SPOCs for implementation of program
- b) Not to engage in any unfair or unethical trade practices or any other business practice, which defeats the purpose of this agreement

7. Assigned Directors

At least one individual from the list below of the three organizations will be required for Reserved Decisions:

- a) Centurion-Gram Tarang: Mr Abhinav Madan or Mr Dipankar Das or Mr Debasish Panda
- b) ManipalHospitals: Mr Partha Das or Dr Vasudha Shetty or Mr Kosal Ram

8. Reserved Decisions

It is mutually agreed that unanimous consent of Assigned Directors of both organizations will be required for the following decisions:

- a) New locations;
- b) Terms of internship of Student-Trainees;
- c) Training infrastructure; and
- d) Marketing material
- e) Leveraging other Government schemes like PMKVY, DDU GKY etc. for subsidizing the training cost which shall be done after mutual consultation

9 CONFIDENTIALITY

- a) Each of the Parties recognizes, accepts and agrees that all information obtained or disclosed, including but not limited to all the content of this Agreement, all data, documents, case files, applications, papers, statements, slips, marketing literature and any and all other trade secrets, confidential knowledge or information of either Party relating to its business, practices and procedures ("Information") which may be provided or communicated by such Party to other Party in connection with the Party and/or course of performance of this Agreement, is and shall remain the sole property of such Party providing such Information and shall be of a strictly private and confidential nature and shall be treated as confidential by the other Party, unless otherwise stated in this Agreement or agreed to by the Parties;
- b) During the term of this Agreement and thereafter, neither Party shall make use of any such Information for any purpose whatsoever, which is not necessary for the discharge of its obligations under this Agreement, or to the disadvantage of the Party providing such Information, nor shall the Party receiving such Information disclose or disseminate it to any person other than the Party providing the Information or persons designated by such Party;
- c) The receiving Party shall treat the Information received from the disclosing Party with at least the same degree of care that it treats its own confidential information, but in no event with less than a reasonable degree of care;
- d) Each Party agrees that any unauthorized use or disclosure of Information may cause immediate and irreparable harm to the disclosing Party for which money damages may not

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constitute sufficient remedy. In such an event the disclosing Party may seek injunctive relief as appropriate;

- e) However, the receiving Party may deliver or disclose Information to any statutory or other Government Authority to affect compliance with law or in response to any legal process provided that the receiving Party shall give to the disclosing Party, a prompt written notice thereof.
- 10. Other terms of the agreement
 - a) Students-trainees must be covered by a group insurance policy for life, mediclaim & accident insurance by Centrurion Gram Tarang
 - b) This agreement will be valid for a period of 3 years. The agreement may be renewed for a further period on mutually agreed terms and conditions
 - c) Both Parties shall not apply for or receive any grant from any private, corporate or government entity in relation to the Courses, without the prior written permission of either parties in consultation with Manipal
 - d) Manipal shall not have any liability towards any act or omissions of CENTURION /GTET which has not been specifically authorized by Manipal in writing. CENTURION /GTET shall indemnify Manipal Hospitals and/or the members of the Medical Professional Team performing the Services against all such loss or damage suffered by them occasioned on account of breach of this obligation by CENTURION /GTET.
 - e) Notwithstanding anything contained herein CENTURION /GTET acknowledge that the services provided by Manipal are in good faith and CENTURION /GTET agree to hold harmless, compensate, provide security for financial reimbursement to Manipal Hospitals and/or the members of the Medical Professional Team against any claims which may arise from the contract.
 - f) CENTURION /GTET acknowledge that each of Manipal Hospital services is not exclusive to CENTURION /GTET and that Manipal Hospital may engage in similar services to other persons and entities.
 - g) ManipalHospital shall keep Centurion-Gram Tarang fully indemnified and harmless from nonperformance or breach or violation of any of the terms and conditions of this Agreement, including all terms and conditions as may be amended and made applicable from time to time, and for breach of trust or any negligence towards fulfilling its responsibilities.
- 11. Termination
 - a) The agreement shall be dissolved and terminated, and its business wound up upon the first to occur of the following:
 - b) Mutual agreement of the Parties or Either Party can terminate the agreement with a minimum notice of at least 90 days in writing by other party without assigning any reason whatsoever;
 - c) Operation of law;
 - d) Material breach of this Commitment by any Partner(s), which breach is not cured within (e.g., fifteen (15) days) after written notice thereof from the non-defaulting Partner(s);
 - e) In case of disputes, the parties would first resort to arbitration before the matter can be taken to any cost of justice.

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f) All matters arising out of this Agreement are subject to Bangalore jurisdiction only.

Upon termination:

- a) Manipal Hospital & Centurion- Gram Tarang shall ensure that the on-going training for the admitted students will remain unaffected and all the terms and conditions agreed hereunder shall apply mutas mutandi till the completion of the training.
- b) PARTIES shall immediately discontinue the use of the other party's name and all trademarks, trade names, property and merchandise marks or trade dresses and any other designations associating CENTURION-GRAM TARANG with Manipal Hospital;
- c) immediately cease displaying and/or using any and all signs, stationery, packaging, forms, advertising and any other printed or other matter and other objects used in connection with the CENTURION-GRAM TARANG name or schemes or documents containing or bearing any of the marks or names;
- 12. Arbitration
 - a) Without prejudice to the provisions hereof, in the event of any dispute, difference, conflict or question arising between the Parties hereto relating to or concerning or arising out of this Agreement, the same shall be referred to arbitration subject to the provisions of this clause and the Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996.
 - b) The arbitration shall be conducted by a sole arbitrator appointed mutually. If the parties are unable to agree upon an arbitrator, then the arbitration shall be conducted by a panel of three arbitrators. Each Party shall be entitled to appoint one arbitrator and shall bear the cost of such arbitrator. However, the cost of the arbitration venue, if any, and the cost for other facilities required for smooth conduct of the arbitration proceedings shall be paid by the Parties in equal proportion.
 - c) Any Party seeking the resolution of any dispute, difference or claim arising out of or in relation to this Agreement by way of arbitration shall notify the other Party or Parties against whom relief is claimed within 15 days of the occurrence of such dispute, difference or claim, as the case may be ("Arbitration Notice"). The Parties shall nominate an arbitrator within 15 days of the receipt of the Arbitration Notice. If any Party fails to appoint an arbitrator within the said period of 15 days, then the arbitration shall be conducted by the arbitrators already appointed by the other Parties. In the event all the Parties fail in appointing their respective arbitrators then the arbitration shall be conducted by a sole arbitrator appointed by the competent court.
 - d) The arbitrators appointed by the Parties shall have the power to issue interim directions if an application in this regard is filed by any one or more Party.
 - e) The arbitration proceedings shall not exceed six months from the date of appointment of the arbitrators.
 - f) The arbitrators shall issue a reasoned award and such award shall be final and binding on the Parties.
 - g) The venue of arbitration shall be Bangalore, Bhubaneswar or Delhi and the language of arbitration shall be English.

WHEREAS:

Department of Biochemistry, Biotechnology & Crop Physiology and Department of Plant Pathology, M.S.Swaminathan School of Agriculture, Centurion University of Technology and Management, Parlakhemundi, Odisha is engaged in analytical testing services;

WHEREAS, BE is engaged in the research, development and commercialization of pharmaceutical and biological products;

WHEREAS, the Parties desire to engage in business discussions in order to evaluate the possibility of analytical testing services relating to development of methods and production of reagents (for testing pharmaceutical products) to BE ("Purpose");

AND WHEREAS, in order to further the discussions with respect to the Purpose, each Party may need to share its confidential information with the other Party;

1. Definition

"Information" shall mean all communications and all information whether written, visual or oral or expressed through electronic medium by one party ("Disclosing Party") to the other party ("Receiving party") without limitation, any information relating to products, operations, processes, plans or intentions, know-how, trade secrets, market opportunities, business affairs, prices, sales figures, expenditures figures or any other financial or accounting information. 3. Scope

4) Limitations

The undertaking at clause 2 above shall not apply to the Receiving Party in respect of any information which:

- b) Was known to and recorded by the Receiving Party prior to the disclosure by the Disclosing Party (as can be established by the Receiving Party from its written records).

WHEREAS, the Company OSSC Ltd (first party) required the Foundation/certified paddy/non-paddy seeds to fulfill the demand of the farmers in the State of Odisha has sought empanelment of the firms to produce & supply the high yielding varieties of both paddy and non-paddy seeds and the Second party has agreed to make available the desired variety of paddy/non-paddy seeds for doing that on contract basis for season i.e. Kharif/Rabi as at Annexure- V.

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WHEREAS, M/s Centurion University of Technology and Management has agreed to deliver Foundation/Certified paddy/non-paddy seeds out of Kharif/Rabi produce as per the terms and conditions specified herein under and at the price to be fixed for the firms by OSSC Ltd. on FOR basis.

WHEREAS, it is deemed expedient and necessary to define the terms and conditions for the purpose of this contract, the first party and the second party hereby agree as under.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS:

ROLE OF ORGANIZER/ PRODUCER/ FIRMS A.

1. The first party shall place indent with the second party, for requirement of Foundation and Certified stage-1 paddy/ non-paddy seeds for supply of the same to the designated godowns under the control of Zonal Managers, Odisha State

Seeds Corporation Ltd. on FOR basis.

- 2. The second party shall produce the details of seed production implemented inside the State of Odisha and Registration of area with the OSSOPCA along-with list of growers and acreage will be submitted to the Zonal Manager, Odisha State Seeds Corporation Ltd Berhampur zone unit as and when required by the first party.
- 3. The contract is quantity & quality oriented and Registration of area with the Seed Certification Agency (OSSOPCA). The Registration fee, Inspection, Seed Testing, Sampling and any other charges will be borne by the organizer/producer/Firms.
- 4. Seed processing and packing work is to be taken up by organizer/producer/ firms in their own seed processing units or in the seed processing plants approved by OSSOPCA at their own cost.
- 5. The Original producer or their authorized representative (second party) will be responsible for the supply of fresh Foundation/ Certified seeds of varieties grown in Odisha has agreed and will make available the foundation/certified seeds of

those varieties as shall be available from inside Odisha produce of freshly harvested season (Kharf-/Rabi-)only.

- 6. The guarantee of laboratory standards like physical purity, germination, ODV and moisture % would be given by the Second Party. In case of any complaint, the second party would be responsible for making good the losses to the farmers and/ or to the Company (OSSC Ltd) the copies of the STL Report along with Section-IX certificate will also be submitted to the First party along with consignment.
 - 7. The seed supplied should meet the standards of Minimum Seed Certification Standard (MSCS) and should be treated with seed treating chemicals.

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- 8. Even if the seeds meet the certification standards OSSC Ltd reserves the right to reject the stock if the lot or part thereof are discoloured, lacking luster or on the grounds of admixture found or poor quality.
- The OSSC Ltd reserves the right no to pay the cost of seeds not grown inside Odisha.
- 10. The second party should have valid seed license to supply the seeds to the First party.

B. <u>ROLE OF OSSC LTD & OSSOPCA.</u>

- 1. The Seed Storage godowns from where the tagged seeds are to be supplied will inspected by the Zonal Manager and other members consisting of representative of OSSOPCA and DDA officials/Seed inspector prior to the delivery of seeds from the said godown. The storage seed godown shall be opened for inspection by seed Inspector or other officials as above at any time on prior intimation to 2nd party.
- 2. The second party shall arrange HDPE 20Kg capacity bags and seed treating chemicals as per their requirement.
- 3. The second party will ensure insurance coverage against fire, theft, natural calamities and burglary at their own cost for seeds stored in their godown.
- 4. The seed producer/Firms will be solely responsible for the correct weighment to the seed containers and in case of shortage found in the containers/packed bags the producer shall be responsible for the legal consequences of weights and measures department and loses if any.
- C. RATE

- N.B:- The procurement price shall be fixed by the corporation and that the same shall be calculated per quintal i.e (OSSC Growers price + service charges Rs 400.00 p.q. for paddy and Rs. 600/- p.q for non-paddy) seeds.
 - 2. The rate so fixed for fresh certified and foundation seeds is inclusive of all taxes whatever being levied by the Central/ State Govt. including Octroi and Market cess etc.

D. QUALITY

- 1. The seeds must meet minimum seed standards as per Seed Act-1966 and should be free from any kind of infection/diseases.
- 2. Even if the seeds meet the certification standards, OSSC Ltd reserves the right to reject the stock if it is rain touched, lacking of luster and on the grounds of admixture found in the godown by the supervising staff of OSSC or on such similar grounds or on grounds of poor quality.
- The guarantee of laboratory standard should be given by the second party.
- 4. The details of lot numbers of the seeds along with the SSTL report, Section-9 certificate will be dispatched by original producer or their authorized representative (second party) to be specified destination godown points as specified by the First party.

PAYMENT E.

- The second party will mention the lot wise quantity of seeds supplied in the Bills. The Bill No and Date should invariably be raised by the Second party.
- 2. The Corporation's Head Office at Santarapur (First Party) shall release as amount equal to 80% of the cost of seeds received in shape of A/c payee cheque/ Bank Draft/ RTGS within one month after receipt of Original Bills duly stock entered.
- 3. Balance 20% of the seed cost of seeds will be released:
 - a) On receipt of satisfactory field report on utilization of seeds and test reports from Seed testing laboratories/ receipt of no complaint certificate from DDA or Zonal Manager. In case of any morphological variation on low germination on said lots, the 2nd party shall be solely responsible for taking back the seeds at their own cost and arrangement and also for any surplus left over stock seeds on the said lots.
 - b) The value of the said seed lots shall be deducted from the balance claim of the 2nd party.
- 4. Supplying agencies (^{2nd}. Party) will indemnify the Corporation for any loss liable to be sustained for payment of compensation as per the decision of any consumer forum/Court/Government.
- 5. Any request for revision of rates for supply of seeds shall not be considered by the First party during the contract period of supply.
- 6. The 2nd. Party shall furnish the check list for final settlement of seed cost dues of their firms at Annexure-IV.

Ê. PENALTY

- 1. The Seed Producer/Firms will be solely responsible for the quality of seeds produced and complaints if any received at the field level and any legal consequences thereof including that of compensation payment as may be decided by any authority of Consumer Courts or other Court of law or Govt.
- 2. No supply would be made after the agreed cutoff date i.e 30th June 2019(as per the date mentioned in the supply order) for Kharif and Rabi unless the First party communicates to the Second party the extension of date.

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G. DELIVERY OF SEEDS.

- 1. The seed shall be dispatched by the Second party before the cutoff date mentioned above. The transit time will be included the cutoff date. The 2nd. party shall deliver the required quantity of seeds on FOR destination basis.
- 2. While supplying the seeds, the details of variety, Lot No. and quantity should be clearly indicated in the challan and invoices.
- 3. The Loading and unloading charges shall be borne by the 2nd. party.
- 4. In case the seed lots (whole or part thereof) supplied by the 2nd party remains unutilized by the 1st party and lying in the godowns of OSSC Ltd confirmation in writing is to be given to the 2nd party by the 1st party after end of the season. It shall be the responsibility of the 2nd party to lift the said seed lots at their own arrangement and OSSC Ltd (1st party) will not held responsible for any deterioration of quality.

Sitapur, Paralakhemundi, Gajapati – 761211i, Odisha (Second Party) on the OTHER PART (who for the purpose of this MoU are hereinafter collectively referred to as the Parties).

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The parties having discussed fields of common research interest and allied activities between the two institutions and have decided to enter into long- term collaboration for the promotion of students' training, and quality post-graduate PhD research in the cutting edge technology areas in accordance with the provisions contained in the Guidelines issued vide Letter No. 2-8/2012-HRD dated 25th April, 2014 or as revised from time to time.

WHEREAS the "First Party" is involved in the studies on Research education and extension of Horticultural Crops and allied fields; AND WHEREAS the "Second Party" established vide F. No...2161 dated 24.12.2010 by Govt. of India/ Govt. of Odisha (Name of the Agency) vide No. 04 of 2010 and recognized by University grants commission MSSSoA, CUTM is involved in Teaching, Research and Extension of under graduate, post graduate and Ph.D. studies in the field of Agriculture and allied Sciences to promote advancement of agricultural research and learning to generate appropriate technology.

AND WHEREAS it has been considered expedient to agree in writing to participate jointly in the projects requiring expertise and logistics from both the parties.

Article 1. Scope

1.1 The Second party will recognize the First party as an Institute for conducting research related to the thesis requirement of the research students for **M.Sc. & Ph.D.** The Second party will recognize Scientists of the ICAR Institute as recommended by its Director in accordance with the University rules and regulations for guiding students working for the said degree.

1.2 Operational details of research effort and collaboration will be made in common research programs and/or projects restricted to specific mandated domain within the approved disciplines/divisions. The objective(s) for research work for a student coming from a Second party outside NARS should be exclusively different as far as possible.

1.3 Research instrumentation facility and library facilities available with the First party and The Second party will be made available to the faculty and research scholars. However, the costs of specific consumables will be borne by the respective organizations.

1.4 There shall be an exchange of students for academic, research and training purposes. Accommodation in the Hostel shall be arranged, wherever possible, as per extant rates. The duration of exchange visits will be determined by mutual consent between both the parties.

Article 2. Management

2.1 Director of the First party and the Vice-Chancellor/Head of the Institution of the Second party will be responsible to work out operational details of co-operation between the two organizations and ensure proper and effective implementation of this MoU.

4.5 A copy of the thesis/dissertation will be submitted to the First Party after the award of the degree by the Second party.

4.6 All questions related to this MoU arising during its term will be settled by the parties by mutual agreement. 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GENERAL AGREEMENT FOR COLLABORATION

between the

Centurion University, Odisha

and the

Centre for Sustainable Agriculture, Secunderabad

WHEREAS, Centurion University is an education and research institution and Centre for Sustainable Agriculture is a development organization working on food, farming, environmental and public policy issues, and whose mission includes providing quality learning opportunities for students, scientists and communities, as well as promoting academic research and making fruits of research reach the needy people;

WHEREAS both institutions consider that increasing opportunities for cooperation and exchange increases understanding of the subject deeper and appreciation;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Centurion University of Technology and Management, Odisha (hereafter Centurion University) and the Centre for Sustainable Agriculture, Secunderabad (here after CSA), agree to promote mutual cooperation in training,

FIRST: This general agreement for Collaboration shall establish the criteria under which Centurion University and CSA will carry out joint collaborative activities of mutual interest.

- (g) Use the each other's facilities
- (h) Exchange of academic or scientific materials and publications of common interest; and
- (i) Any other mutually agreed activity that would benefit both institutions.

THIRD: All proposed courses, projects, programs or work agreements including anything contemplated under (a) through (g) above, arising from this General Agreement and its respective terms and conditions including budgets and financial aspects shall first be discussed and if agreed upon, will then be implemented as "Specific Agreements" of collaboration. The Specific Agreements will implement this General Agreement and shall be signed by authorized representatives of both institutions.

FOURTH: Each institution will designate its own personnel to liaise with each other and administer any activities associated with this General Agreement, as well as the development and implementation of any Specific Agreement.

FIFTH: The institutions may, jointly or separately, endeavor to obtain financial resources from other institutions, government agencies and national and international organizations for the development of activities associated with the implementation of any Specific Agreement.





SIXTH: The present General Agreement will become valid upon signature by authorized persons of both institutions and shall remain in effect for a period of five (5) years from its effective date. It may be renewed or amended at any time before the actual expiration date by a written agreement signed by authorized representatives of both institutions.

SEVENTH: This General Agreement may be terminated by either institution upon six (6) months prior written notice to the other partner; however, termination shall not affect the implementation of activities that have already commenced pursuant to a Specific Agreement. Mednutra and CUTM are hereinafter individually referred to as "Party" and collectively referred to as "Parties".

WHEREAS:

- A. The Party of the FIRST PART has a mandate to facilitate empowering responsible nutrition business by way of market access and commercialization, product development, project management, consultancy and investment into startup ventures in nutraceuticals by leveraging its industry network through various programs like **Nutrify India**, **I2C**, and **Nutrabazaar**.
- Centurion University of Technology and Management (CUTM) was formed in August 2010, Β. through an act of Odisha Legislative Assembly. It became the First Multi-Sector State Private University in Odisha. Centurion is a globally accredited human resource center of excellence catalyzing sustainable livelihoods in the less developed markets across the globe. The university envisages the following objectives - provide quality, globally accredited academic programmes in technology and management, provision of globally accredited employability training for less endowed segments of the population, promotion of entrepreneurial culture and enterprise in the target areas, facilitate improved market access to goods and financial services to the target population and promotion of lighthouse project interventions in the target area. The mission of the university is to assist the farming community of the state by imparting education and training. The constituent colleges and research centers of the University have the responsibility of undertaking Teaching, Research and Extension in the areas of Smart Technology, agriculture, food processing and biotechnology. The University is offering Bachelor's and Master's degree programmes in various disciplines and has many National and International research projects under operation.
- C. The Parties hereby express their willingness to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding to facilitate innovation in Nutrition technology and commercialization thereof.

1. SCOPE OF MoU

- Officially represent Nutrify India in India and abroad in nutraceutical industry and Nutrify India will officially represent CUTM in India for Nutra and food processing industry.
- b. Allocate a small fund from each party- Say Rs.1 lac each and call it Nutrify India- CUTM scholarship fund. We will pay a stipend of INR 5000 per month to deserving student for pursuing last year of B.Tech. into nutraceuticals or courses which will have direct or indirect impact on food, phytopharma, nutraceuticals and related fields.
- c. The discovery and the content development done by the student in last year of B. Tech in lab will be property of Nutrify India with CUTM as secondary property owner. As a secondary property owner any transaction that Nutrify India does on those innovations will allow CUTM to benefit in revenue share. (The share pattern shall be mutually defined at the time of each case being executed).
- d. Co-Representation in various media platform. Nutrify India will promote CUTM nutraceutical, phytopharma and related program and CUTM will promote Nutrify India.
- e. Nutrify India will use its expertise of industry network to develop one year nutraceuticals specialization program to be available in B.Tech. Phytopharma. This will enable B.Tech. Phytopharma students to specialize in nutraceuticals. Also, eligible studentsfrom other streams of science and engineering can pursue the specialization program. This can be announced as World's first B.Tech Phyto Pharma in nutraceuticals.

- f. Nutrify India will use its expertise of industry network to give inputs for promoting research and development in food, nutraceutical and allied products and services at CUTM.
- g. The Parties shall provide an office space representation in the respective premises to free of cost with basic amenities.
- h. The Parties agree to set up trimestral meetings that may be held by videoconference allowing exchanges regarding their respective missions, their projects and the evolution of their partnership.
- i. These meetings shall at least be composed of representatives of the Parties, however, it is expressly agreed that at such meetings may be convened by one of the Parties any person whose presence would be useful for the achievement of the objectives of this Convention.
- j. The Parties agree to communicate on their relationship and the achievements resulting from this MoU, and only for these purposes, they mutually and reciprocally authorize each other to use their respective corporate names and/or trademarks.

2. DURATION OF THE MOU

The total time frame for the engagement would be for a period of three years effective from the date of signing of the MoU. The term of this MoU may be extended as may be mutually decided by the Parties by means of an amendment to the MoU.

3. FINANCIAL ARRANGEMENT

No financial commitment from any party will be assumed unless a formal approval / acceptance to that effect has been accorded through a signed arrangement between both the Parties prior to commencement of the work. 4. AMENDMENTS TO MoU

This MoU may be amended with mutual consent of both the Parties in writing. No amendment or addendum shall be effective unless it is in writing and signed by authorized representatives of both Parties hereto.

5. INSURANCES

The Parties certify that all the risks related to their liability with regard to the events that may occur during the present MoU are covered by one or more insurance policies.

6. TERMINATION OF MoU

Either Party may terminate this MoU at any time by providing a written notice of 30 day's if it reasonably believes that the other Party's performance, or any aspect of it, results, or might breach



any legal, regulatory, ethical or audit independence requirement in the jurisdiction, or any other reason, by registered post, courier service, personal delivery, fax or through electronic mail to the Party at its last known address of business. In the event of termination/expiry of this MoU, Parties shall return the materials/documents of other party on request.

7. FORCE MAJEURE

Neither Party shall be held responsible for non-fulfilment of their respective obligations under this MoU due to the exigency of one or more of the force majeure events such as but not limited to acts of God, war, flood, earthquake, strikes, lockouts, epidemics, riots, civil commotions, etc., provided on the occurrence and cessation of any such event, the affected party thereby shall give a notice in writing to the other party within one month of such occurrence or cessation. If the force majeure conditions continue beyond six (6) months, the parties shall jointly decide about the future course of action.

8. ASSIGNMENT OF MoU

The rights and/or liabilities arising to any Party of this MoU shall not be assigned except with the written consent of the other Party and subject to such terms and conditions as may be mutually agreed upon.

9. CONFIDENTIALITY AND NON-DISCLOSURE

Except as otherwise contemplated by this MoU, each Party (the "receiving party") undertakes that, in order to protect the proprietary interest of the other Party (the "disclosing party") in the disclosing Party's confidential information, it will not, during the term of this MoU nor at any time thereafter, either use or exploit in any manner, or directly or indirectly divulge or disclose to others any of the disclosing party's confidential information. The receiving party shall treat all confidential information disclosed to it as strictly confidential and only use such confidential information for the purposes of this MoU. Each Party shall ensure that its directors, officers, employees, agents, representatives, students, faculty, Affiliates and attorneys comply at all times with this confidentiality undertaking. This clause does not apply to (i) information is public other than because of a breach of this clause; (ii) disclosure required by law; or (iii) disclosure to a Party's related companies, auditor, banker or advisors. Specific confidentiality and non-disclosure agreement will be a part of specific MoUs agreed by the Parties for each project.

This confidentiality obligation shall remain valid for 5 years from the termination of this agreement.

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



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WHEREAS, M/s M/s Centurion University of Technology and Management has agreed to deliver Foundation/Certified paddy/non-paddy seeds out of Kharif/Rabi produce as per the terms and conditions specified herein under and at the price to be fixed for the firms by OSSC Ltd. on FOR basis.

WHEREAS, it is deemed expedient and necessary to define the terms and conditions for the purpose of this contract, the first party and the second party hereby agree as under.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS:

A. ROLE OF ORGANIZER/ PRODUCER/ FIRMS

1. The first party shall place indent with the second party, for requirement of Foundation and Certified stage-1 paddy/ non-paddy seeds for supply of the same

to the designated godowns under the control of Zonal Managers, Odisha State Seeds Corporation Ltd. on FOR basis.

- 2. The second party shall produce the details of seed production implemented inside the State of Odisha and Registration of area with the OSSOPCA along-with list of growers and acreage will be submitted to the Zonal Manager, Odisha State Seeds Corporation Ltd Berhampur unit as and when required by the first party.
- The contract is quantity & quality oriented and Registration of area with the Seed Certification Agency (OSSOPCA). The Registration fee, Inspection, Seed Testing, Sampling and any other charges will be borne by the organizer/producer/Firms.
- Seed processing and packing work is to be taken up by organizer/producer/ firms in their own seed processing units or in the seed processing plants approved by OSSOPCA at their own cost.
- 5. The Original producer or their authorized representative (second party) will be responsible for the supply of fresh Foundation/ Certified seeds of varieties grown in Odisha has agreed and will make available the foundation/certified seeds of

those varieties as shall be available from inside Odisha produce of freshly harvested season (Kharf-/Rabi-)only.

- 6. The guarantee of laboratory standards like physical purity, germination, ODV and moisture % would be given by the Second Party. In case of any complaint, the second party would be responsible for making good the losses to the farmers and/ or to the Company (OSSC Ltd) the copies of the STL Report along with Section-IX certificate will also be submitted to the First party along with consignment.
- 7. The seed supplied should meet the standards of Minimum Seed Certification Standard (MSCS) and should be treated with seed treating chemicals.

- 8. Even if the seeds meet the certification standards OSSC Ltd reserves the right to reject the stock if the lot or part thereof are discoloured, lacking luster or on the grounds of admixture found or poor quality.
- 9. The OSSC Ltd reserves the right no to pay the cost of seeds not grown inside Odisha.
- 10. The second party should have valid seed license to supply the seeds to the First party.

B. ROLE OF OSSC LTD & OSSOPCA.

- The Seed Storage godowns from where the tagged seeds are to be supplied will inspected by the Zonal Manager and other members consisting of representative of OSSOPCA and DDA officials/Seed inspector prior to the delivery of seeds from the said godown. The storage seed godown shall be opened for inspection by seed Inspector or other officials as above at any time on prior intimation to 2nd party.
- 2. The second party shall arrange HDPE 20Kg capacity bags and seed treating chemicals as per their requirement.
- The second party will ensure insurance coverage against fire, theft, natural calamities and burglary at their own cost for seeds stored in their godown.
- 4. The seed producer/Firms will be solely responsible for the correct weighment to the seed containers and in case of shortage found in the containers/packed bags the producer shall be responsible for the legal consequences of weights and measures department and loses if any.
- C. RATE
 - 1. Procurement price for EOI empanelled (MOU) firs (including HDPE bags and seed treating chemicals) FOR destination.

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- N.B:- The procurement price shall be fixed by the corporation and that the same shall be calculated per quintal i.e (OSSC Growers price + service charges Rs 400.00 p.q. for paddy and Rs. 600/- p.q for non-paddy) seeds.
 - 2. The rate so fixed for fresh certified and foundation seeds is inclusive of all taxes whatever being levied by the Central/ State Govt. including Octroi and Market cess etc.

- D. QUALITY

 - 1. The seeds must meet minimum seed standards as per Seed Act-1966 and should be free from any kind of infection/diseases.
 - 2. Even if the seeds meet the certification standards, OSSC Ltd reserves the right to reject the stock if it is rain touched, lacking of luster and on the grounds of admixture found in the godown by the supervising staff of OSSC or on such similar grounds or on grounds of poor quality.
 - 3. The guarantee of laboratory standard should be given by the second party.
 - 4. The details of lot numbers of the seeds along with the SSTL report, Section-9 certificate will be dispatched by original producer or their authorized representative (second party) to be specified destination godown points as specified by the First party.

E. PAYMENT

- 1. The second party will mention the lot wise quantity of-seeds supplied in the Bills. The Bill No and Date should invariably be raised by the Second party.
- 2. The Corporation's Head Office at Santarapur (First Party) shall release as amount equal to 80% of the cost of seeds received in shape of A/c payee cheque/ Bank Draft/ RTGS within one month after receipt of Original Bills duly stock entered.
- 3. Balance 20% of the seed cost of seeds will be released:
 - a) On receipt of satisfactory field report on utilization of seeds and test reports from Seed testing laboratories/ receipt of no complaint certificate from DDA or Zonal Manager. In case of any morphological variation on low germination. on said lots, the 2nd party shall be solely responsible for taking back the seeds at their own cost and arrangement and also for any surplus left over stock seeds on the said lots.
 - b) The value of the said seed lots shall be deducted from the balance claim of the 2nd party.
- 4. Supplying agencies (^{2nd}. Party) will indemnify the Corporation for any loss liable to be sustained for payment of compensation as per the decision of any consumer forum/Court/Government.
- 5. Any request for revision of rates for supply of seeds shall not be considered by the First party during the contract period of supply.
- 6. The 2nd. Party shall furnish the check list for final settlement of seed cost dues of their firms at Annexure-IV.

F. PENALTY

1. The Seed Producer/Firms will be solely responsible for the quality of seeds produced and complaints if any received at the field level and any legal

consequences thereof including that of compensation payment as may be decided by any authority of Consumer Courts or other Court of law or Govt.

2. No supply would be made after the agreed cutoff date i.e _____ (as per the date mentioned in the supply order) for Kharif and Rabi unless the First party communicates to the Second party the extension of date.

G. DELIVERY OF SEEDS.

- 1. The seed shall be dispatched by the Second party before the cutoff date mentioned above. The transit time will be included the cutoff date. The 2nd, party shall deliver the required quantity of seeds on FOR destination basis.
- 2. While supplying the seeds, the details of variety, Lot No. and quantity should be clearly indicated in the challan and invoices.



6.1 All those who wish to register as trainees or for Master/Doctoral programs under this MoU must apply for admission at the Second party. The allocation of Major Guide/Advisor would be finalized before the registration and will be governed by the provisions laid out in Items 3.2.1A and 3.2.2A of the Guidelines for the students to conduct research for their degree programs as trainees at ICAR institutions as notified vide Letter No. 2-8/2012-HRD dated 25th April, 2014 or revised Guidelines, if any, as may be issued from time to time, for the students from within NARS and Outside NARS, respectively.

6.2 Admission of the students and the award of degrees for different programs will be the responsibility of the Second party as per the rules and regulations.

6.3 Allotment of the students at the First party will be done by the approval of Director of the First party and Vice-Chancellor/Head of the Institution of the Second party.

6.4 The First party would have the right to screen the student's eligibility for admission based on their

6.5 The PME Cell of the First party in consultation with the representative of the Second party shall decide the location and sharing quantum of research work.

6.6 The number of student(s) at any particular time will be subjected to the availability of research facilities and scientists' time to guide thesis research at the First party institution. 6.7 Any student(s) admitted to the First party for training/postgraduate research, if found violating

the rules and regulations laid down by the First party or indulge in such activities that amount to tarnishing the image of the Institute, or cause damage to the property, the registration of such student(s) would be summarily terminated. The Second party will not complete the formalities of issuing the certificates to such students until they compensate the losses to the First party. 6.8 Fees will be charged from the students by the First party as per Guidelines for the students to

conduct research for their degree programs as trainees at ICAR institutions viae Letter No. 2-8/2012-HRD dated 25th April 2014 or revised Guidelines, if any, as may be issued from time to time. No fee may be charged by the First party from the students registered with AU/DU within NARS. However, a student registered with a Second party, outside NARS, "The students shall be uniformly charged a fee of Rs.20,000/- for training/research/dissertation up to duration of 3 months and @ Rs.30,000/- per semester for the work exceeding three months. The fee structure is to be reviewed periodically after two years by the AU/DU or the ICAR Institute, as the case may be. However, the students may be charged a fee of Rs.10,000/- for training duration of three months not leading to a

Article 7. Entry into effect, modification and termination

For

Training of Trainers Programe and Outcome Based Trainings, Assessments and Certification of Trainees trained under various Skill Development Schemes along with RPL implemented by MPSSDEGB

This agreement has been made and agreed upon between the parties mentioned below, signed on the 11th day of the month of *March*' year 2022.

BETWEEN

Madhya Pradesh State Skill Development and Employment Generation Board (MPSSDEGB) represented by the Chief Executive Officer (hereinafter referred to as 'MPSSDEGB' which expression shall unless repugnant to the context or meaning thereof, include its successor in office, legal representatives and permitted assigns) as the FIRST PARTY here in after referred to as 'MPSSDEGB'

AND

The, Centurion University of Technology & Management (CUTM) incorporated under CUTM ACT 04/2010, Govt. of Odisha having their registered office at Alluri Nagar, Paralakhemundi, Dist-Gajapati, Odisha and Skill Assessment & Certificate Cell havi0ng head office at, 2nd Floor, Madhusudhan Building, centurion University Campus, Ramchandrapur, Jatani, Dist: Khordha, Pin-752050, Odisha, represented by Shri. Parthasarathi Mohanty, National Head Skill Assessment & Certification

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(hereinafter called the "Assessment & Certification Body", which expression shall, unless repugnant to the context or meaning thereof, be deemed to mean and include its successors and assigns) on behalf of the Second Party.

A. Background and Purpose

MPSSDEGB is a body under the chairmanship of Hon'ble Chief Minister of Madhya Pradesh to act as the apex body for monitoring, coordination, convergence and providing overall policy direction for skill development activities in Madhya Pradesh. The State Government has set up State Skill Development Mission as a nodal body to anchor the skill development agenda in the State. MPSSDEGB is expected to play a significant role in escalating the pace of skilling, through identification of key sectors for skill development in the State, as well as coordinating with State Govt. Departments, industry and private training organizations. In order to ensure that the State is able to translate the large availability of working age population into a demographic advantage, the State would be launching various skill development schemes to raise the skilling quotient of Madhya Pradesh by providing access to short term demand driven training courses to youth in employable trades.

"CUTM" has been notified as a Skill University by the Govt. of Odisha in its Gazette Extraordinary No. 1383 dated 30th August'2017. It's School of Vocational Education and Training has been recognized as a Centre of Excellence by the Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship (Refer Gazette no. F. SD-17/123/2019-SA/MSDE dated 18th November' 2019).

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MPSSDEGB and CUTM will henceforth be referred to independently as the 'First Party' and 'Second Party' respectively and collectively as the 'Parties'.

THIS AGREEMENT WITNESSES AND THE PARTIES HERE TO AGREE TO THE FOLLOWING:

B. OBJECTIVE

This Agreement is for collaboration on conducting Training of Trainers programme and introduction of Outcome based Trainings, Assessments and Certification for trainees trained under various skill development schemes implemented by MPSSDEGB.

The primary objective of this agreement is to improve employability of the trainees of various skill development schemes implemented by MPSSDEGB through timely completion, appropriate assessment and certification of the trainees by CUTM.

C. Roles and responsibilities of MPSSDEGB

MPSSDEGB is the implementing organization of all skill development schemes in the state of Madhya Pradesh and will be responsible for as the following activities:

- a. Assessment and Certification of trainees under various skill development schemes: MPSSDEGB will permit CUTM to conduct assessments and certify the trainees of batches trained under the Training Partners
- b. Nodal Officer/Coordinator: MPSSDEGB will designate and recommend one person who will be responsible for overseeing/coordinating the entire program.
- c. Payment schedule to CUTM: MPSSDEGB will make payments to the CUTM after successful assessment and certification of the candidates present for assessment as per the Common Cost Norms notified by the Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship, Government of India. A separate work order would be issued as and when any of the scheme is launched by MPSSDEGB. Payment will be released to the second party within 45 days of bill submission by first party.
- d. MIS: MPSSDEGB will appoint a dedicated operator for generating the MIS who will be responsible to coordinate the technical operations with CUTM.
- e. Physical Audit: MPSSDEGB will conduct random audit of 3-5% of the batches which have been assessed in each quarter. MPSSDEGB shall randomly select these batches and carry out the performance audit. In case, some issue is raised during the physical audit, the same will be raised to CUTM and the same will be jointly resolved.
- f. Assessing of Trainees in Centre/camps: MPSSDEGB may be formulate a team which would observe Assessing process in training centres/camps prescribed by the CUTM for conducting training by TP/PIA. MPSSDEGB would notify the CUTM after successful Assessing process of training centers/camps
- g. MPSSDEGB will allocate the batches to CUTM through their login to get the assessments conducted through the CUTM.
- h. MPSSDEGB will transfer the assessment fees to CUTM as mentioned.
- D. Roles and responsibilities of CUTM:
- Single Point of Contact (SPoC): The CUTM will designate and recommend a SPoC who will be responsible for the overall assessment related activities from MPSSDEGB.
- b. Identification of Trades/ Occupations: Help identify and suggest in-demand Trades/ Occupations for which employment opportunities exist in the state of Madhya Pradesh. MPSSDEGB may revise the list of courses from time to time in consultation with the CUTM.
- c. Student Assessment and Certification: CUTM will organize the timely assessment and certification of training. CUTM will issue a joint certificate to the successful candidate along with MPSSDEGB, where signature and seal and logo of both the parties will be placed in the certificate along with Skill India logo. A format for the certificate will be mutually agreed between the Parties.
- d. Training of Trainers: CUTM will cooperate in facilitating Training of Trainers Programme in mutual consultation with MPSSDEGB as per the guidelines of CUTM.

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- e. CUTM will share the pool of Assessor list so that MPSSDEGB verify then time to time.
- f. CUTM have responsible for group insurance of certified candidates in RPL Schemes under guideline of PMKVY(3.0). CUTM will be paid @INR 76.70 per certified candidate after producing relevant documents in this regard.

The following process will be followed for Assessments and Certification that will be the responsibility of CUTM.

- a. CUTM will get the update of new batches to be assessed via the designated portal. CUTM would upload the result of candidates after due verification by the designated person of the MPSSDEGB on the portal. Certificates would thereafter be generated for the successful candidates from the portal and would be disbursed online to the successfully assessed candidates and would be available to TSP.
- b. Certificates and results will be declared in 10 working days from the date of assessments for STT & RPL.
- c. CUTM will be responsible for fair and proper conduct of the assessment. Any issue that arises on this will be amicably discussed between MPSSDEGB and the CUTM and will be resolved.
- d. CUTM to conduct the assessment in local language/ English as far as possible.
- c. CUTM to ensure that batches will be assessed within 07 days of batch end date at the Training Centre approved by MPSSDEGB. If this timeline is not adhered to, it would be considered as a default. Payment by MPSSDEGB may be withheld in case of such a default by the CUTM.
- f. In case of reassessment, full assessment fee will have to be paid by the TSP to CUTM. The Agency should give information of the Bank Account (which is to be shared with the TSPs) at Annexure III
- g. CUTM shall provide a statement of received and pending payments along with requisite details as per the payment schedule mutually agreed upon.
- h. CUTM will check the credentials of the candidates as per norms and conditions. The details
 of infrastructure and logistics required are included as Annexure-II of this Agreement.
 The following documents will be checked to authenticate identity at the Test Centre:
 - ID proof- as mentioned in Annexure II
- MPSSDEGB's Training Partner will make all arrangements at the center (raw material, lab facilities, and infrastructure setup) for CUTM to conduct the online/offline assessment. Information about such arrangements will be provided to the training partner by CUTM; Details of infrastructure and logistics required are included as Annexure – II of this agreement.
- j. Assessment for the complete batch will be done as per the norms of the CUTM in terms of number of minimum and maximum number of candidates. Candidates will be assessed on the assessment criteria and Question Banks set by CUTM.

- MPSSDEGB need to clarify regarding the Job role from CUTM before assigning any batch for assessments.
- E. COORDINATION OF MEETINGS AND LIASION.

The Parties to the Agreement will establish procedures to facilitate regular contact at the executive and operational levels to discuss issues arising in relation to the Project under the chairmanship of CEO, MPSSDEGB.

All the parties will hold a meeting, between senior officials at least once every three months to discuss the coordination of matters relevant to the operation of this agreement. Additional meetings may also be called by MPSSDEGB in a week's notice. MPSSDEGB will coordinate with all the stake holders for meetings and other issues related to all skill development issues implemented by MPSSDEGB.

F. OTHER COVENANTS

- The use of the name, logo and/or official emblem of any of the Parties on any publication, document and/or paper concerning the project under agreement is allowed only, after seeking explicit permission in writing by either Party.
- Any difference or dispute between the Parties concerning the interpretation and/or implementation and/or application of any of the provisions of this Agreement shall be settled amicably through mutual consultation or negotiations between the Parties, without reference to any third Party.
- This Agreement will come into effect on the date of signature by both the parties. This
 Agreement shall remain valid for a period of three year only from the date of its signing and can
 be extended on mutually agreed terms and conditions.
- 4. This Agreement may be varied at any time by mutual agreement of the Parties in writing. It shall be reviewed three months before the end of contract date or at a time mutually agreed by the Parties for possible renewal.
- Any other matter not included in this agreement which is necessary for the smooth functioning of the Scheme shall be finalized between MPSSDEGB and CUTM on mutual terms and conditions.
- 6. The Agreement or any part, thereof, may be amended at any time during its tenure only by consent in writing of the Parties concerned.
- Both the parties have set their hand in presence of the witness on the 11th day of the month of March year 2022 as mentioned above.
- 8. The Board may by written notice of suspension to the agency, without any obligation (financial or otherwise) suspend all the payments (previous or upcoming) to the agency hereunder if the

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agency shall be in breach of this contract or shall fail to perform any of its obligations under the contract, including the carrying out of services; provided that such notice of suspension

- a. Shall clearly specify the nature of the breach or failure, and
- The reason for delay or nonperformance of the services can be solely attributable to the Agency
- c. Shall provide an opportunity to the Agency to remedy such breach or failure within a period not exceeding seven days after receipt by the agency of such notice of suspension

G. Force Majeure

Neither Party shall be liable for default, failure or delay in the performance of any of its obligations under the agreement for the time and to the extent such default, failure or delay is caused due to a 'Force Majeure' event, and includes ,but not limited to, riots ,civil commotion ,wars, hostilities between nations, government laws, orders regulations, embargos, action by the government (s) or any agency thereof, act of god, storms, fires, accidents, strikes, sabotages, explosions or other similar event, beyond the reasonable control of the affected party in the event that either party is wholly or in part, prevented from or hindered in carrying out or observing any of the terms or condition of this Agreement due to an force majeure event, such party shall give written notice to the other party in writing as soon as possible after the occurrence of such event , by giving full particulars of the reason for such prevention of hindrances, and the parties shall, in good faith, consult each other and take necessary measure for the resolution of the affairs so prevented or hindered.

H. Arbitration

In the event of any dispute or difference relating to this agreement between the parties hereto, such disputes or differences shall be resolved by mutual consultation. If such resolution is not possible, then the unresolved disputes or differences shall be referred for adjudication through Arbitration by a sole Arbitrator to be appointed by the parties under Arbitration& Conciliation Act: 1996 (26/96) or any statutory modifications or re-enactment thereof and the rules made thereunder and for the time being in force shall apply to arbitration proceedings. The venue of such arbitrator, The language of arbitration proceedings shall be English.

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FOUNDATION SEED AGREEMENT FOR FIELD CORN, RICE& VEGETABLES

This Agreement is entered on 22ndday of March, 2022

BETWEEN:

M/s ProFarm Seed India Pvt. Ltd, a Company incorporated under the Companies Act 1956 and having its Registered Office at 202, II Floor, JaySree Arcade, Gundalapochampally, Secunderabad; Telangana – 501401hereinafter for the sake of brevity referred to as'ProFarm' which expression unless repugnant to the context or meaning thereof shall mean and include its representatives, assigns, administrators and successors in interest of the ONE PART;

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AND

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Centurion University of Technology and Management, aMulti-Sector State Private University, through an act of Odisha Legislative Assembly in August 2010 and having its Registered Office at-Village Alluri Nagar, P.O R.Sitapur, Paralakhemundi,Gajapati, Odisha hereinafter for the sake of brevity referred to as '**CLIENT**' which expression unless repugnant to the context or meaning thereof shall mean and include its representatives, assigns, administrators and successors in interest of the SECOND PART;

M/s ProFarm Seed India Pvt. Ltd and Centurion University of Technology and Management, are hereinafter collectively referred to as "ProFarm" and "CLIENT".

WHEREAS:

- A. ProFarm was incorporated in the year 2006 and established its research facilities at Hyderabad with the primary objective to develop superior quality crop Germplasm;
- B. ProFarm has developed through its elite Germplasm various elite hybrids in Field Corn,Rice varieties and Hybrids, Vegetables adapted to Indian climatic condition.
- C. This Foundation Seed Agreement is restricted to Field Corn, Rice and Vegetables.
- In the year 2022, the CLIENT desired and was in need of Foundation
 Seed developed by ProFarm.
- E. After careful consideration and due deliberations, ProFarm agreed to supply the Foundation Seeds to CLIENT and accordingly Foundation Seed Agreement was entered into between the parties on March 22,2022.

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NOW THEREFORE, IN CONSIDERATION OF THE PREMISES AND MUTUAL COVENANTS SET FORTH HEREIN, THE PARTIES HEREBY AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

1. VALIDITY OF AGREEMENT:

This Agreement shall remain in full force and in effect from 22ndMarch, 2022 till 21stMarch, 2025.

2. TERMINATION AND CONSEQUENCES OF TERMINATION

A. TERMINATION WITHOUT CAUSE:

Either party may terminate this Agreement without cause by providing the other party written notice at least one hundred eighty (180) days prior to the desired termination date.

If **CLIENT** terminates this agreement, **CLIENT** will immediately pay all legal dues in full and will strictly adhere to the use of supplied Foundation Seed the way stipulated in this contract.

If **ProFarm** terminates this agreement, **CLIENT** will not receive Foundation seed of any hybrid(S).

B. TERMINATION WITH CAUSE:

ProFarm has right to terminate this contract any time with cause. The cause could be violation of any provision stipulated in this contract including consistent untimely payment, improper use of Foundation Seed, and breach of confidentiality under **Clause 16**. In case of termination under 2 B all dues from **CLIENT** shall be immediately payable, and **CLIENT** shall no longer receive any Foundation seed from **ProFarm**.

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RESPONSIBILITIES OF PROFARM

- **3. ProFarm** agrees to provide the **CLIENT** viable Foundation Seed in a conscientious, competent and professional manner within the realms of professional regulatory standards.
- 4. ProFarm agrees to provide the CLIENT after sales services as are deemed necessary based on need and mutual understanding(including handholding and on-site training of resources limited to Production of Hybrid Seed and the cost of boarding, travelling and other related expenses to this shall be borne by CLIENT).
- 5. ProFarm shall have full ownership of all Foundation Seed supplied to CLIENT. CLIENT has right to use, not ownership, of the Foundation Seed provided by ProFarm for production and distribution of Commercial Seed to distributors, dealers or directly to farmers by CLIENT. Any other use of Foundation Seed by CLIENT such as for breeding, multiplying or development of new hybrid/variety is strictly prohibited.
- 6. ProFarm acknowledges that in and as a result of business relationship hereunder, ProFarm will be provided with confidential information such as acreage under seed production by CLIENT, location of seed production and market concentration of CLIENT.ProFarm agrees that it shall not, disseminate, disclose, or divulge in any way confidential information disclosed to ProFarm.

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- 7. ProFarm will submit to CLIENT on a seasonal basis an invoice for Foundation Seed provided as well as requested to be produced for CLIENT at the rate as per Exhibit A. Invoice will include the name or mutually agreed code of the Foundation Seed, quantity, acres to be planted and price for using the **ProFarm** Foundation Seed.
- 8. In the Event of sale, transfer of business or change in shareholding of ProFarm, ProFarm shall ensure that the successor honors this agreement.

RESPONSIBILITIES OF CLIENT

9. TRADEMARK:

"ProFarm" is Brand name of ProFarm. "CENTURION UNIVERSITY OF TECHNOLOGY AND MANAGEMENT" is brand name of the CLIENT. Both parties agree not to use each other's Brand name without written consent and agreement.

- That the CLIENT agrees to provide and notify ProFarm of its yearly 10. requirement of Foundation Seed of different hybrids developed by ProFarm not later than April 30 of every year for both Kharif and Rabi season seed production planting for next year by the CLIENT. Minimum indented quantity for each hybrid each season shall be as mutually agreed by both parties from time to time.
- 11. CLIENT agrees to pay ProFarm for the Foundation seed as per the Proforma Invoice submitted by ProFarm. Twenty five percent (25%) of the Proforma Invoice value will be paid at the time of placing indent for Foundation Seed by CLIENT to ProFarm (by April 30 every year) and

corresponding Proforma Invoice submitted by **ProFarm** to **CLIENT** and remaining seventy five percent (75%)at the time of supply of Foundation seed as per the Invoice provided along with the Foundation Seed supplied to the **CLIENT**. That payment shall be made by the **CLIENT** to **ProFarm** by **NEFT/RTGS** at the time of placing indent and/or <u>seven (7)</u> days prior to scheduled delivery of Foundation Seed to the **CLIENT** from **ProFarm**.

- 12. CLIENTagrees to pay Fifty Percent (50%) advance at the time of placing indent instead of Twenty Five Percent (25%) as per clause Eleven (11) of this contract, if any of their past payment was delayed beyond seven (7) days.
- **13. CLIENT** agrees to pay interest at prevailing Bank rate but not less than 12% (twelve percent) per annum for any late payment of invoice from **ProFarm**.
- 14. CLIENT agrees that in case of not paying and lifting Foundation Seed produced on their indent, not only CLIENT will forfeit their advance payment of 25% (twenty-five percent) but will be legally liable to pay in full for all the foundation seed which they gave indent as per clauses 09 and 10 of this agreement.
- 15. CLIENT agrees that all Foundation Seed provided by ProFarm is owned by ProFarm and CLIENT shall have no right to ownership of the Germplasm of Foundation Seed.
- **16. CLIENT** agrees not to use any **ProFarm** Foundation Seed for breeding, multiplying, inbred line development and any other research purpose.

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- 17. CLIENT agrees not to sub-contract any **ProFarm** Foundation Seed to other seed company for the purpose of production and distribution of commercial seed or for any other purpose.
- 18. CLIENT agrees to distribute seed produced from ProFarm Foundation seed supplied to CLIENT, under this contract, only in their own brand name or any other brand name as informed to ProFarm on timely basis.
- 19. CLIENT acknowledges that in and as a result of business relationship hereunder, CLIENT will be provided with confidential information such as general genetic background of Foundation seed, adaptation in different climatic condition, planting schedule for proper synchronization of female and male under seed production etc. CLIENT agrees that it shall not, disseminate, disclose, or divulge in any way confidential information disclosed to CLIENT to other seed company.
- **20.** Any breach of Clause 16 and 17 shall constitute a material breach, which gives rise to termination of this agreement and consequent damages.

21. REPRESENTATIONS AND WARRANTIES

- 21.1 Each Party hereby represents and warrants to the other Party as follows:
- (i) It is duly organized and validly existing under the laws of India, and has full power and authority to enter into this Agreement and to perform its obligations under this Agreement; and

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(ii) The execution and delivery of this Agreement and the performance by it of its obligations under this Agreement have been duly and validly authorized by all necessary corporate actions on the part of it. This Agreement constitutes a legal, valid and binding obligation of such Party enforceable against it in accordance with its terms.

(iii) There are no legal, quasi-legal, administrative, arbitration, mediation, conciliation or other proceedings, claims, actions, governmental investigations, orders, judgments or decrees of any nature made, existing, or pending or, to its best knowledge, threatened or anticipated, which may prejudicially affect the due performance or enforceability of this Agreement or any obligation, act, omission or transactions contemplated hereunder; and

(iv)That it will comply with all applicable laws and regulatory requirements in connection with the performance of its obligations under this Agreement, and will not do or permit anything to be done which might cause or otherwise result in a breach of this Agreement or cause any detriment to the transactions herein envisaged.

22. DISPUTE RESOLUTION, GOVERNING LAW AND JURISDICTION

22.1. If any dispute arises between the Parties hereto during the subsistence or thereafter, arising out of or in connection with, the validity, interpretation, implementation or alleged breach of any provision of this Agreement, the Parties hereto shall endeavor to settle such dispute amicably. The attempt to bring about an amicable settlement shall be treated as having failed as soon as one of the Parties hereto, after reasonable attempts, which shall continue for not less than 15 days, gives a notice to this effect, to the other Party in writing.

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22.2. In case of such failure, only after the passing of 15 days from the receipt of the notice referred to in Clause23.1, the dispute shall be referred to a sole Arbitrator, who shall be mutually appointed by the Parties. The Arbitration proceedings shall be governed by the Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996 and shall be held in Hyderabad.

22.3. This Agreement shall be interpreted and governed in all respects by the laws of India and the Courts of Hyderabad shall have exclusive jurisdiction to entertain and try any dispute or matter relating to or arising out of this Agreement.

23. NOTICES

23.1. Any notice pursuant to this Agreement shall be in writing signed by or by some person duly authorized by the person giving it and may be served by leaving it or sending it by facsimile, prepaid recorded delivery or registered post addressed as follows (or to such other address as shall have been duly notified in accordance with this Clause):

If to Centurion University of Technology and Management: Village Alluri Nagar, P.O R.Sitapur, Paralakhemundi,Gajapati, Odisha .

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- **23.2.**All notices given in accordance with Clause 24.1 shall be deemed to have been served as follows:
 - (A) if delivered by hand, e-mail at the time of delivery;
 - (B) if posted at the expiration of 5 (five) days after the envelope containing the same was delivered into the custody of the postal authorities; and

(C) if communicated by facsimile, on receipt of confirmation of successful transmission.

24. MISCELLANEOUS

24.1.This Agreement shall not be construed as creating a partnership, joint venture, or employment relationship between the parties. Moreover, **ProFarm** shall perform this Agreement as an independent company. Neither **ProFarm** nor any agent/employee of **ProFarm** shall represent, act, or purport to act as, or be deemed to be, the agent, representative, employee, or servant of the **CLIENT** nor shall **CLIENT** or anyone employed by it be, represent, act, or purport to act as or be deemed to be, the agent, representative, employee, or servant of the **Servant** of **ProFarm**.

24.2. Intending to be legally bound, each party warrants that this Agreement is executed by their respective authorized representatives. This Agreement shall be binding and enforceable upon the parties hereto and the respective successors or assigns. Counterpart and facsimile signatures and copies shall constitute originals.

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24.3. This Agreement may be amended or modified, and any of its terms or provisions hereof may be waived but only by written instrument, executed by authorized representatives of both **CLIENT** and **ProFarm**.

24.4. The failure of either party to require the performance of any provisions herein or as of the exercise of any option or right herein contained shall not be construed as a waiver or relinquishment for the failure of such covenant, right or option, but the same shall remain in full force and effect unless the contrary position is expressed in writing.

24.5. This Agreement sets forth all of the covenants, promises, agreements and conditions and understandings between the parties and there are no covenants, promises, agreements, conditions or understandings either oral or written, between the parties hereto other than those set forth herein.

24.6. If any of the provisions of this Agreement shall be invalid or unenforceable, the remainder of this Agreement shall not be affected thereby, and the remaining terms, covenants and conditions of this Agreement shall be valid and be enforceable to the fullest extent permitted by law or equity.

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MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

This Memorandum of Understanding is signed on 18th April 2022, between The Forest College & Research Institute, Hyderabad at Mulugu, Siddipet district, Telangana herein after referred to as FCRI represented by Dean, Forest College & Research Institute, Hyderabad at Mulugu, Telangana.

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And

Centurion University of Technology and Management, R. Sitapur, Odisha herein after referred to as CUTM, Represented by the Registrar, Centurion University of Technology and Management, R. Sitapur, Odisha.

Forest College & Research Institute (FCRI) was established in the year 2016. The FCRI is being run by the State Forest Department of Telangana and Managed by the Governing Board which is constituted by the Government of Telangana. Being a new institute, during this academic year the 4-year B.Sc. (Hons.) Centurion University of Technology and Management, through Vice Chancellor, CUTM, Paralakhemundi, Odisha, 761211, India (here in after called "CUTM" which the expression shall unless repugnant to the context includes its successors and assigns) of the **First Party.**

AND

CSIR - Central Building Research Institute, Roorkee through Director, CSIR-CBRI, having its office and laboratory at Roorkee, Uttarakhand, 247667, India (hereinafter called as 'CSIR-CBRI' which the expression shall unless repugnant to the context includes its successors and assigns) of the Second Party.

Centurion university of Technology and Management, Odisha and CSIR - Central Building Research Institute are herein after individually referred to as the 'Party' and collectively as 'Parties'

WHEREAS,

i) Centurion University of Technology and Management is the first multi-sector Private State University of Odisha, established by the Act (no.4 of 2010) of the State Legislature. The University is approved by UGC, Accredited 'A' grade by NAAC and also got 12B status from UGC. Centurion University has been accorded the status of a "Skill University" and has been notified by the State Government through gazette notification no 1383 of 30 August 2017.As a Skill universityprovides hand on training in various sectors and also well occupied with research facility.

- ii) The CSIR Central Building Research Institute (CSIR-CBRI) at Roorkee, Uttarakhand, India, is a constituent establishment of Council of Scientific and Industrial Research, India and has been vested with the responsibility of generating, cultivating and promoting building science and technology in the service of the country.
- iii) Both CUTM and CSIR- CBRI are leading premier national organizations in their respective fields and are desirous of working together to work as a team to achieve national objectives, undertaken with their best abilities and maximum mutual cooperation with intent of helping each other in the building science and technology development - a vital component in India's march towards becoming a developed nation.

NOW, IT IS HEREBY AGREED BY AND BETWEEN THE PARTIES AS FOLLOWS:

1. Scope of the MoU

In the spirit of intellectual cooperation, scholarly exchange, and the development of national partnership with leading institutions, Centurion University of Technology and Management, Odisha, India and the **CSIR-Central Building Research Institute**, **Roorkee, India** agrees to establish a program of exchange and collaboration on related matters of mutual interest that may emerge over time.

- 2. The purposes of the cooperation are to promote collaborative research and to facilitate the exchange of ideas, the development of new knowledge, and to enhance high quality research acumen. The major thrust of the research on which the parties will cooperate are research areas of civil and geotechnical engineering which include: landslide and earthquake studies, disaster mitigation studies and remediation measures, geosynthetics, foundations, ground improvement, subsurface geological and geophysical investigations, application of remote sensing and GIS, industrial waste and contaminated soil, reuse of waste materials, geoenvironmental issues, slope stability investigation and warning issues in soil and rock medium, AI & ML, landslide hazard mapping and analysis, Drone based applications for geological structures and evaluation of civil structures among others.
- 3. The modes of cooperation will include:
 - a. Exchange of faculty and students for the purpose of research, learning, and teaching.
 - b. Joint guidance of students of CSIR-CBRI and CUTM, Odisha on the mutually agreed areas of the faculty, students and both the institute.

- c. Use of infrastructural facilities on project basis while agreeing upon the respective institute norms.
- d. Development and implementation of co-operative research projects, professional development programs, and capacity building efforts.
- e. Promoting joint publications.
- f. Scope for CUTM, Odisha UG and PG students to work under the purview of internship on live projects of CSIR-CBRI.
- To achieve the goals of this cooperation, both parties will, in-so-far as the means of each allow:
 - Promote institutional exchange by inviting faculty and student researchers of the partner institution to participate in appropriate research activities;
 - b. Organize of symposia, conferences and meetings on timely research issues;
 - c. Develop and carry out joint research programs; and
 - d. Exchange information pertaining to the agreed-upon research areas.
- 5. Prior to the initiation of any particular project or activity, the specific terms of cooperation and exchange for that project will be discussed and agreed upon in writing by an appropriate responsible representative of both the institutions.
- 6. Either party may propose to the other specific individual research project(s) for collaboration. Such proposals may be made at any time and the parties will develop an agreement for each agreed-upon project. The protection and exploitation of any intellectual property arising out of a research project will be addressed in each individual project agreement.
- Day to day implementation of this agreement will be coordinated by the Planning and Business Development Group (PBD) of CSIR - CBRI and the Vice-chancellor & H.O.D Civil Engineering of CUTM, Odisha.
- Each institution agrees to release and hold the other harmless from and against any claims, damages, liability or costs, to the extent such claims, damages, liability or costs arise from the negligent or wilful acts or omission of the other university or any of its agents or employees in connection with their respective performance under this MoU.
- The parties agree that in the course of implementing this MoU, they will not engage in unlawful discrimination on the grounds of race, gender, sexual orientation, age, religion, social class, national or ethnic origin or disability.
- 10. Both parties understand that all financial arrangements for specific exchange activity must be mutually agreed upon and will depend on the availability of funds. In addition, the scope of the activities will be subjected to the funds available at the institutions for the type of collaboration undertaken and any financial assistance that may be obtained by either from external sources. Both institutions acknowledge and understand that all financial arrangements, if any, will be subjected to proper written agreement and availability of funds for each activity/project undertaken.

- 11. No institution shall have the right to use the name or logo of another institution without the prior approval of that institution in writing.
- 12. Amendments to this MoU may be made at any time after consultation and agreement between two institutions. Any such amendment must be in writing and signed by both parties.
- 13. This MoU will remain in force for a period of five (5) years from the date of signing. The MoU can also be suitably modified, as agreed to by both the parties, to reflect an increased scope, nature of engagement/activities including financial commitments, if any. Prior to the expiration date, the MoU may be reviewed for possible renewal. In addition, either party may terminate the MoU in advance of its normal expiration by providing the other with six months' prior written notice. In this case persons already approved as exchange participants will be allowed to complete their exchange visits under the conditions specified at the time of their invitation to the host institution.
- 14. Rights regarding publications, patents, royalty, ownership of software / design / product etc. developed under the scope of this MoU shall be decided on case to case basis by both the parties. The % of expenditure from partner institute to apply and maintenance of IPR/Patent shall be decided on case to case basis by both the parties.
- 15. Arbitration : Any disputes or difference shall be referred to "Delhi International Arbitration Centre (DIAC), Delhi High Court, New Delhi"

AND

Trishakti Homes Consultancy Pvt. Ltd.,a company incorporated under the laws of India and having its registered office at H. No. 3-11-494, Plot No. 30&20, 3rd Floor, Opp. Reliance Petrol Pump, LB Nagar, Hyderabad, represented by its Chairman & Managing Director V. Srinivas Singh, (hereinafter referred to as "**Cultivator**" which expression shall include unless repugnant to the context or meaning thereof deemed to include its successor in interest and assigns) of the **SECOND PART**.

University and Cultivator shall be individually referred to as 'Party' and collectively as 'Parties'.

WHEREAS:

- A. The University is undertaking research for developing innovative and effective means, scientific research methodologies, modalities, know-how and technology (hereinafter referred to as "**Methods**") to growing various agricultural and commercial crops.
- B. In pursuance to the above, the University is desirous of testing the efficacy of the Methods and as such has approached the Cultivator to implement the Methods for the purpose of

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cultivating the Crops, more specifically detailed in **Annexure III** of this MOU.

C. The Cultivator is the owner of an extent of land situated in Ongole, Hindupur & Hyderabad and other future projects in both Telugu states.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and other good and valuable consideration, in reliance upon the mutual covenants and agreements hereinafter set forth and subject to the terms and conditions herein contained, the Parties hereto agree as follows:

- 1. The roles and responsibilities of the University are more particularly described in **Annexure I.**
- 2. The roles and responsibilities of the Cultivator are more specifically described in **Annexure II.**
- 3. Crops to be cultivated are detailed in **Annexure III.**

4. **Representations and Warranties**

- 4.1 The Parties represent and warrants that:
 - 4.1.1 they have full power, right and authority to enter into this MOU and perform their respective duties and obligations under this MOU in accordance with the terms and conditions of this MOU;
 - 4.1.2 they shall maintain all necessary permits, licenses, approvals and clearances from governmental authorities

or any third parties as may be required under law;

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4.1.3 the entry into and performance of this MOU would not conflict or violate any applicable law, rule or decree, judgement or order of court of law as of the date hereof;

5. Confidentiality

The Parties agree that all information and data of the other party to which each party has access under this MOU will be treated as confidential information.

6. Intellectual Property Rights

Nothing herein shall be construed as granting to either Party, by implication, estoppel or otherwise, any license or other right under any intellectual property right of the other Party. Parties hereby agree that all rights, title, and interest in and to all intellectual property rights of either Party shall vest and reside in, and be the exclusive property of such Party. Parties hereby agree that it shall not claim any right, title interest in such intellectual property rights of the other Party.

7. Indemnity

The Cultivator ("**Indemnifying Party**") agrees to defend, indemnify, and save harmless its officers and directors, employees, agents (collectively "**Indemnified Parties**") from and against all losses, claims, damages to property, costs, taxes, duties, additions, penalties, interest thereon or expenses of any kind, including reasonable attorney's fees, incurred/sustained by or caused to the Indemnified Parties on account of any (i) misrepresentation or breach of obligation or warranty under this MOU by the Indemnifying Party; and (ii) violation of any applicable laws.

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8. Term and Termination

8.1 This MOU shall be effective **immediately** until terminated by either Party in accordance with the terms of this MOU or as mutually agreed.

9. General

- 9.1 This MOU and any action related thereto will be governed and interpreted by and under the laws of India and courts at Telangana shall have the exclusive jurisdiction for settlement of any disputes or differences arising between the Parties out of this MOU.
- 9.2 Nothing contained herein shall be deemed to create an association, partnership, joint venture or relationship of principal and agent or master and servant, or employer and employee between the Parties. The Parties shall remain independent contractors at all times, and no Party shall act as the agent for the other.
- 9.3 Neither Party will use the other Party's name or marks or refer to or identify the other party in any advertising or publicity releases, or promotional or marketing correspondence to others, without such Party's written approval.
- 9.4 The failure of either party at any time to require performance by the other party of any provision hereof shall in no way affect the full right to require such performance at any time thereafter. Nor shall the waiver by either party of a breach of any provision hereof be a waiver of any succeeding breach of the same or any other such provisions or be a waiver of the provision itself.
- 9.5 Any notice given hereunder shall be in writing, in the English language, and shall be effective upon delivery to a Party via courier, overnight delivery service, or certified mail at the address set forth herein or at such other address as may be designated in writing by a Party hereto.
- 9.6 The Parties shall not assign this MOU or any of its rights and obligations hereunder, without the prior written consent of the other Party and any such attempted assignment shall be null and void.

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- 9.7 Any provision of this MOU which is prohibited, unenforceable or is declared or found to be illegal, unenforceable or void in any jurisdiction shall as to such jurisdiction be ineffective only to the extent of such prohibition or unenforceability without invalidating the remainder of such provision or the remaining provisions of this MOU or affecting the validity or enforceability of such provision in any other jurisdiction. If any such invalidity substantially affects or alters the basis of this MOU, the Parties shall negotiate in good faith to amend and modify the provisions and terms of this MOU as may be necessary or desirable in the circumstances to achieve as closely as possible the same effect as the original provisions and terms of this MOU.
- 9.8 Any change, alteration, amendment, or modification to this MOU must be in writing and signed by authorized representatives of both the Parties. This MOU sets forth and shall constitute the entire understanding between the Parties with respect to the subject matter hereof and shall supersede any and all prior agreements, understandings, promises and representations made by one Party to the other concerning the subject matter.

ROLES & RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE UNIVERSITY

During the term of this MOU, the University shall be responsible for the following:

- 1. Make available to the Cultivator the Methods required for cultivation of the Crops on the Land.
- 2. Deploy personnel and students from time-to-time to advise, train and supervise the Cultivator and his personnel on efficacious implementation of the Methods and cultivation of the Crops. The suggestions and recommendations of the advisors from the university would be imparting to the cultivator Rs.30000 (Rupees thirty thousand only) a month.
- 3. The Cultivator shall be solely responsible to bear the travel and accommodation expenses incurred as a result of deploying the above personnel. The University shall communicate to the Cultivator, in writing, the quantum of the travel by Land i.e. by Bus/Train and by Air in unavoidable situations and accommodation expenses incurred for the above. In addition to the TA/DA, the cultivator must ensure an advisory fee of Rs. 3000 (Three Thousand only) per day per advisor whenever, he/she visits.
- 4. The Cultivator shall be entitled to payback the travel and accommodation expenses to the University under this MOU provided the Cultivator has confirmed the expenses incurred in writing well in advance and the payments will be made on actuals.
- 5. The Cultivator/University may plan the travel needs either by Land.
- 6. The University shall advise and recommend the Cultivator on the saplings to be purchased for the purpose of implementing the Methods and cultivating the Crops.
- 7. The University shall take responsibilities related to farm management and imparting timely advise. The Crops list are provided in Annexure III of this MOU.

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ANNEXURE II

ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE CULTIVATOR

During the term of this MOU, the Cultivator shall be responsible for the following:

- 1. The Cultivator shall strictly implement the Methods for cultivating the Crops on the Land.
- 2. The Cultivator shall at its sole discretion be entitled to purchase the saplings recommended by the University either directly from the University or third parties.
- 3. Provide updates in respect of the cultivation of the Crops every three months once.
- 4. Notify the University in writing of the entire produce/yield generated from cultivating the Crops after expiry of the yielding time of each Crop(s), provided in Annexure III of this MOU.

- d) It shall be the sole responsibility of FICCI FLO to provide necessary hand holding to candidates/entities for availing the above-mentioned services of CUTM CCIE.
- e) It shall be an additional/optional responsibility of FICCI FLO to leverage their member network to identify mentors (from industry) for entrepreneurs under CUTM CCIE.
- f) It shall be an additional/optional responsibility of FICCI FLO to work with CUTM CCIE to identify a panel of experts who act a 'gatekeepers' and guide the entrepreneurs through various stage of their journey.
- g) It shall be an additional/optional responsibility of FICCI FLO to work with CUTM CCIE to identify potential investors via FICCI FLO's broader network.
- h) It shall be an additional/optional responsibility of FICCI FLO to work with CUTM CCIE's induction as a partner into FICCI's start up agenda.
- It shall be an additional/optional responsibility of FICCI FLO to work with CUTM CCIE to hold at least 2 state level events (such as hackathons etc.) with national participation from target entrepreneurs.
- j) It shall be an additional/optional responsibility of FICCI FLO to work with CUTM CCIE to facilitate interaction with FICCI members (industry leaders) to showcase Centurion University and its social outreach entities.
- k) It shall be an additional/optional responsibility of FICCI FLO to work with CUTM CCIE to recognize CUTM CCIE as a strategic partner and actively promote its contribution to FICCI FLO's mission.
- III. FOR FORCE MAJEURE

-) Either party shall be excused from performance of this MOU during and to the extent that performance is prevented by the occurrence of unforeseen causes beyond the reasonable control of the Parties by and without the negligence of the parties claiming excuse.
- b) Such causes include, without limitation, acts of god, war, fire, explosion, earthquake, flood, and government restrictions and limitations. The party claiming excuse shall give immediate written notice thereof to the other, in any case not later than 15 days, following the occurrence of such event.
- c) If performance is held up for a continuous period of more than 4 months from the date of first notice, then the two parties shall review the situation and agree upon a course of action so as to protect their interest. A party claiming Force Majeure shall exercise reasonable diligence to seek to overcome the Force Majeure event and to mitigate the efforts thereof on the performance of its obligations under this MOU.

IV. INDEMNIFICATIONS:

It is specifically understood and agreed that CUTM CCIE and its employees shall be indemnified and kept indemnified against all claims, charges, damages, losses, actions, penalties, prosecution and consequences due to non-compliance of any of the applicable laws and regulations by FICCI FLO or its employees, contractor/their workmen and in respect of any third party liabilities claims, actions etc. that may arise in the course of performance of obligations specified in this MOU by employee(s) or agent(s) or other person(s) of CUTM CCIE. No liability whatsoever would accrue to CUTM CCIE and its employees under this MOU emanating from the activities that are to be undertaken in performance of this MOU.

V. TERMINATION

Both parties shall have the right to terminate this MOU under the following circumstances.

- a) If any information furnished by the other party is found to be false or incorrect at any time during the course of implementation of the above project or thereafter both parties shall have the right to terminate the MOU with a prior notice not less than 15 days.
- b) FICCI FLO shall have to ensure compliance with various legislation that are enacted from time to time, rules framed there under and guidelines issued for carrying out the project and in the event of default, CUTM CCIE shall have a right to terminate the MOU.

VI. AMENDMENTS:

a)

Either party may, with the prior intimation to other and with the prior written consent of the other party, may reduce, limit and/or expand the scope of the work based on the mutually agreed terms and conditions, with a prior written notice of not less than 15 days

VIII. JURISDICTION:

The MOU shall be governed by and constructed according the laws in force in India. The parties hereby submit to the exclusive jurisdiction of the Court situated at Bhubaneswar without prejudice to the arbitration clause state hereunder.

VIII. ARBITRATION:

Any and all disputes, controversies and conflicts ('Dispute') or differences of any nature whatsoever or regarding any right, liability, act, omission or account of any of the parties hereto arising out of or in relation to this MOU or the performance or non-performance of the rights and obligations set forth herein or the breach, termination, invalidity or interpretation shall resolve or settle amicable through mutual negotiations and discussion. If the dispute is not settled amicably then in that case it shall be referred to the sole arbitrator to be appointed jointly by FICCI FLO and CUTM CIE and shall be in writing and shall be final and binding to each party.

IX. NOTICE:

Any notice to be given under this MOU shall be in writing and shall be deemed to have been duly and properly served upon the parties hereto if delivered against acknowledgement of by Registered mail with acknowledgement due, addressed to the parties herein at the following address or changed addresses, duly notified by the Parties. Any notice transmitted by fax or other form of recorded communication shall be deemed given and received on the first business day after its transmission.

- 14. The terms and conditions mentioned herein shall commence on the execution of this MOU for all the students of the partner and shall continue for a period of Four Academic Years or for such period as may be determined or extended by the parties from time to time by written notice.

a) Confidential Information:

a. The Parties own and may develop, compile and own certain proprietary techniques, trade secrets, and confidential information, which are very valuable to that Party (collectively, "Confidential Information"). The disclosing Party may disclose Confidential Information to the other during the performance of the Services.

b. Confidential Information is any information relating to the disclosing Party that is not accessible by the general public and includes not only information disclosed by the Party, butalso information developed or learned by the Party during the performance of the Services. TheDisclosing Party's Confidential Information is to be broadly defined and includes all information, which has or could have commercial value or other utility in the business that the other Party is or may be engaged in and the unauthorized disclosure of which could be detrimental to the interests of the disclosing Party, whether or not such information is identified by disclosing Party.

c. Confidential Information includes, but is not limited to, details of the disclosing Party and business contacts, developments, designs, inventions, software, techniques, know-how, data, marketing, sales or other business information, scripts, costs and resources, tools used; and all derivatives or improvements to any of the

b) Non- disclosure and Protection: The Parties agree that at all times during or subsequent to the performance of the Services, the Parties will keep confidential and not disclose or cause to be disclosed, publish, disseminate or otherwise make available or use Confidential Information, except for the receiving Party's own use during the Term of this MOU and only to the extent necessary to perform the Services. The receiving Party shall not remove or cause to remove tangible embodiments of, or electronic files containing, Confidential Information from the disclosing Party, without prior approval of the disclosing Party and vice versa.

TERM AND TERMINATION

INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS

- d) deceives or misleads the addressee about the origin of such messages
 communicates any information which is grossly offensive or menacing in nature;
- e) impersonates another person;
- f) contains software viruses or any other computer code, files or programs designed to interrupt, destroy or limit the functionality of any computer resource;

For implementation of Building institutional collaboration for arranging support towards clinical teaching, practical training, faculty development, internship training and placement of paramedical and allied health science students of the Centurion University

Henceforth referred to as the **Project** for the agreement in subsequent paragraphs.

That the both parties agreed to the scope of this agreement for effective implementation of the project as per the laid down terms and conditions

Background and Scope of the partnership agreement:

The CUTM plans to become a clinical establishment and offer outdoor based preventive, promotive and curative eye care services for its students, staff and to community in Jatni as part of its social services and Corporate Social Responsibility initiative.

It is a super specialty eye hospital with all the sub specialties like cornea, retina, glaucoma, Pediatric ophthalmology and oculoplasty. Itis equipped with various modern and state of art instruments& equipment, facilities and provides regular outdoor and indoor services in the domain of primary, secondary and tertiary eye care services.

The P C Sharma Eye Hospitalsituated inAmbala, Haryanaisagreeable to enter into a resource sharing model of collaboration to provide opportunity for clinical teaching, practical training, internship training and placement of paramedical and allied health science students of CUTM.

- joining the course at SPAHS, CUTM Jatni for 1 day*. Providing internship opportunity under supervision in eye care clinical/ industry setup for
- 1 year during 7th & 8th semester as per course content of B. Optometry students .
- 6 months for post completion of skill training or certificate course content of VT/RT/COA/COSA/COTT 0
- Providing placement opportunity in eye care clinical/ industry setup after campus interview for 0
- M. Optometry, B. Optometry students after successful graduation .
- COA/COSA/COTT students after successful completion of the certificate course and certification by Allied 0 0
- Medical Council, Odisha. VT/RT skill development students after successful completion of the course and certification by HSSC
- . That, both the parties agrees to implement the project whose details are given in Annexure-1.

The implementation of the project would take place in the P C Sharma Eye Hospital, Ambala, Haryana and in the School of Paramedic & Allied Health Sciences (SPAHS), Centurion University of Technology & Management, Jatni campus.

The timeline for implementation of the project would be from June 27, 2022onwardsfor a period of 3 yearswhich may be extendable with due consent ofboth the parties.

The implementation of the project effectively and efficiently will be guided, supervised and implemented by an Executive committee which will periodically meet and review progress in implementation for expansion and improvement of clinical training services. The constitution of the committees and functioning of the committees will be guided by the Terms of reference and Scope of work defined respectively.

The roles and responsibilities for implementation of the project would be shared between partners as per details given below:

Roles of the first party:

- 1. The first party would select a nodal officer who would be the point person for day to day coordination, facilitation, review, monitoring of the progress of project with the 2nd party to implement project as per
- 2. The first party will nominate three officials for representing 1st party in the Executive committee like, Nominee of the Management, Medical Director and Hospital Manager.
- 3. The first party will be responsible for jointly designing of new courses, periodic review & up-gradation of the existing teaching training curriculums through an expert committee to design the courses to make them health sector industry oriented.
- 4. The first party will be responsible for identification and deputation of suitably qualified doctors/ trainer for delivering quality training and skilling support, internal and external assessments, quality assurance of training/teaching and health research activities in SPAHS, CUTM and in P C Sharma Eye Hospitalas per subject domain.
- 5. The first party would remain responsible for monitoring the quality of the clinical teaching, practical training, internship training and placement of paramedical and allied health science students of Centurion University as part of project servicesimplemented by the 2nd party. The 1st party would be responsible to give feedback based on monitoring observations to the 2nd party if any need for improvement is observed in written, over telephone, through e-mail immediately/ as soon as possible.



- 6. The first party would give technical inputs for finalization of the activities in the clinical establishment at
- 7. The first party would coordinate and convene periodic (monthly/ quarterly) review meetings with the executive committee. This meeting would address solutions of problems that are put up by the 2nd party to facilitate implementation of the project as per timeline.
- 8. Interns will be selected after an online test/interview
- 9. Selected interns will have a monthly stipend of Rs 3000(without food) or Rs 1500 with food as the
- candidate wishes for optometry interns. For VT/RT/COA/COSA/COTT ,stipend will be Rs 1000 with food
- 10. Shared accommodation will be provided by the hospital without any charges, water supply will be free of charge, electricity will have to be paid by the interns as per bill and interns will have to abide by the
- 11. Interns will have to bring their own retinoscope. Interns will be provided aprons by the hospital, amount of which will taken as security and returned at the end of internship as per the condition of apron.
- 12. Interns will have to deposit 10K as tuition fees and 5k as caution money.For VT/RT/COA/COSA/COTT ,Rs
- 13. Inters will have to maintain discipline in hospital and any misconduct or fraud can lead to immediate termination from internship with no refund of caution money.
- 14.15 leaves will be sanctioned during the period of training. After successful completion, a certificate of completion will be provided by the hospital along with refund of caution money as applicable(only for BSc optometry interns).For VT/RT/COA/COSA/COTT, 7 leaves will be sanctioned.
- 15. Working days are from Monday to Saturday with Sunday duties including camps in rotation.

Roles of the second party:

- 1. The second party willselect a nodal officer who would be the point person for day to day coordination, facilitation and necessary discussion with the 1st party to move the project as per timeline.
- 2. The second party will <u>nominate three officials</u> for representing 2nd party in the Executive committee like, Nominee of the Management; Dean, School of Paramedical and Allied Health Sciences; and Director,
- School of Paramedics and Allied Health Sciences, CUTM University. 3. The second party will be responsible for jointly designing and implementation of new courses, periodic review & up-gradation of the existing teaching training curriculums through an expert committee to
- implement the courses to make them health sector industry oriented. 4. The second party would be responsible for applying, certification to state appropriate authority for
- transforming the School of Paramedics and Allied Health Sciences, CUTM as a clinical establishment as
- 5. The second party will be responsible for upkeep and maintenance of various clinical infrastructure, facilities and equipment to provide clinical services like outdoor and investigation (pathology, radio diagnostic, optometry, cardiac care, dental care, physiotherapy etc.,) services in phased manner.
- 6. The second party would be responsible to undertake corrective actions immediately or within reasonable time to respond based on monitoring observations by the 1st party.
- The second party would coordinate and convene periodic (monthly/ quarterly) review meetings with the executive committee. This meeting would address solutions of problems that are put up by the 1st party to 7. facilitate implementation of the project as per timeline.

NOW THEREFORE THE PARTIES HERETO AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

ARTICLE 1. PARTNER'S PROJECT

Centurion University of Technology & Management, Odisha, will create Knowledge on wheels as Farmers Experience Zone, in a Mobile Unit for small and marginal farmers.



The main goal of the project is to skill small and marginal farmers in Odisha and Andhra Pradesh villages on advanced agriculture. Mobile van equipped with 3D farmer experience center would be used for deployment of such training in rural areas on farm training. This would be a cutting edge training facility for farmers with no access to formal education or the ability to attend courses in University campus. The long term goal is to create a sustainable path for enabling capacity building of 50 lakhs Indian Farmers in agri-tech and improve their incomes by at least 20% by adopting agri-technology.

3D technology offers advanced modelling framework to simulate 'what if scenarios' to test concepts and develop optimal solutions to increase yield rate of the farm ranging from ploughing path optimization and field design to field ergonomic analysis and plant life cycle.

Detailed activities that Centurion University Digital Farm using 3D Experience Platform intends to incorporate in the Farmers experience zone for training:

- Creation of Digital Farm
- Modelling of the Farming machinery system behaviour
- Agriculture product optimization
- Farming machinery optimization for environment purpose
- Project management
- Ploughing path design and optimization
- Modelling a field data acquisition vehicle
- Analysis ergonomic requirements
- Modelling a plant life cycle
- Analysing, defining and planning workflow to manage the farm
- Scientific Vermi- compost creation
- Mushroom Farming

In addition the benefits from the project execution that will be shared with other teaching organizations are:

- Configuring and optimizing a game like visit of Digital Farm
- Prototyping of Farm equipment tools: Using 3D printing, the developed digital models of various equipment's.

The Partner will share all the content created as part of this project, to Dassault Systemes Foundation and will allow Dassault Systemes Foundation to use and share with other institutes.

Public Beneficiaries of this project will be: Small and Marginal Farmers of all age groups. The areas identified are socio-economically marginalized communities in remote rural & tribal belts with major farmers from SC/ST category and often woman members also involved in helping in agriculture. - 2) During this term or any renewal term, either party may terminate this agreement upon sixty (60) days prior written notice to the other party, if any party is in breach of any material provision of this agreement and such breach is not cured within fifteen (15) days after written notice thereof is received by the breaching party.
- 3) In the event of termination of this agreement prior to expiry of the defined term, Dassault Systemes Foundation shall have no obligation to provide further funding to the partner and partner will continue to execute the project at its own cost.

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ARTICLE 8. MISCELLANEOUS

Neither party shall be liable for any non-performance of its obligations pursuant to the Agreement resulting from an event of force majeure as defined under applicable laws. If the performance of any of the obligations under this Agreement is prevented, restricted or interfered with by reason of fire or other casualty or accident, floods, strike or other violence (not due to any act, neglect or default of the party to Agreement), war or other violence, any law, or regulation of any government, governmental delay, or any act or condition whatsoever beyond the reasonable control of party to Agreement shall be called a "Force Majeure" event.

ARTICLE 9. GOVERNING LAW AND JURISDICTION

This Agreement shall be governed by laws of the Republic of India.

In the event the Parties fail to resolve any dispute related to the subject matter set forth herein within a reasonable time, the dispute shall be referred to for Arbitration in terms of the Arbitration and Conciliation Act 1996 or any statutory modifications thereto the place of Arbitration shall be Mumbai. The relevant courts of the city of Mumbai shall have jurisdiction over any matter arising out of this Agreement.

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

B. Specifics

- 2. Exchange visits of faculty and administrative staff.
- 3. Collaboration in research projects, conferences and publications.
- 4. Collaboration in the creation and implementation of international study programs, including:
 - a. double degree programs
 - b. the development of an MBA or MSc degree conferred by ICD and accredited by the French Government, to be taught 50% in France and 50% in India and to be marketed generally in international markets with the aim of forming batches of international students
 - semester-long programs for ICD students to spend at CUTM as part of their Bachelor program
 - d. opportunities for CUTM Bachelor students to attend ICD for a semester
 - e. opportunities for ICD students to undertake internships with CUTM or one of its associated NGO and industry partners
 - f. opportunities for ICD students to undertake short term study programs in India as part of international groups from other countries
- 5. Collaboration in the development of curriculum materials.
- Exploration of opportunities and means for ICD and CUTM faculty to jointly offer market research and business development consultancy services to French and Indian companies wishing-to undertake business opportunities.

Both institutions agree that all collaboration projects shall be subject to separate agreements that follow the objectives of this Memorandum of Understanding. Both institutions further agree that further forms of collaboration may be added to the cooperation at any time.

3. Promotion of the cooperation

 All activities and materials to promote the present cooperation are subject to bilateral assessment by CUTM and ICD and their publication require written agreement of both institutions.





 Within all promotional activities, communications and publications associated with the cooperation, the usage of the names and logos of CUTM and ICD require mutual written consent.

4. Intellectual property rights

- Intellectual property rights, in particular copyright of material to be used to carry out the activities under this memorandum, shall remain with the originating party unless separately negotiated and agreed upon by the concerned parties.
- Within all publications and communications associated with the cooperation by any party mentioned in this memorandum, the usage of the names and logos of CUTM and ICD require mutual written consent of both institutions.

5. Duration and termination of the cooperation

This Memorandum of Understanding will become effective upon the date of signature by both institutions. It will be valid for a period of 5 years and may be extended for an additional period of 5 years by mutual written agreement.

Either institution may terminate this Memorandum of Understanding by giving not less than 12 months written notice. Any termination shall take into account and offer alternative solutions or compensation to students, professors, and other personnel already involved in any activities under this Memorandum of Understanding and the above mentioned agreements on specific collaborations.

6. Conflict between the cooperation partners

Any dispute arising from the execution of this Memorandum of Understanding or any other agreement in respect to this collaboration shall be settled through amicable settlement. In the event that no settlement can be agreed upon through negotiation, the matter shall be submitted for international arbitration in the place of the respondent, in accordance with the relevant laws applicable in that jurisdiction. The arbitration shall be conducted with respect to the non-commercial nature of the SFEDBAP and the nonprofit organizations involved.

- 1.2 Operational details of research efforts and collaboration will be made in common research programs and/or projects restricted to specific mandated domain within the approved disciplines/ divisions.
- 1.3 Research instrumentation facilities and Library facilities available with the First Party and the Second Party will be made available to the faculty and research scholars. However, the cost of specific consumables will be borne by the respective organizations.
- 1.4 There shall be an exchange of scientists, faculty and students for academic, research and training purposes. Accommodation in hostel shall be arranged wherever possible, as per extant rates. The duration of exchange visit will be determined by mutual consent between both the parties.

Article 2. Management

2.1 Director of the First Party and the Head of the Institution/ Head of CUTM- Department of Fisheries Science of Second Party will be responsible to work out operational details of cooperation between both the parties and ensure proper and effective implementation of the MoU.

Article 3. Exchange of Information

- 3.1 The term "information" includes scientific or technical data, result and/or method of investigations and other information intended to be provided, exchanged or arising under project description entered into pursuant to the MoU.
- 3.2 The parties support the widest possible dissemination of information. Each party in joint projects shall be given the right to use, disclose, publish or disseminate such information for any and all allied purpose.

Article 4. General Provision

- 4.1 It is understood that the First Party and Second Party subscribe to the principle of equal opportunity and do not discriminate on the basis of race, sex, age, caste or religion. Both the institutions/ Parties shall abide by these principles in the administration of this agreement and neither party shall impose criteria for exchange of scientists, scholars or students, which violate principles of non- discrimination.
- 4.2 Both parties understand that all financial agreements will have to be negotiated separately and will depend on the availability of funds.
- 4.3 Both parties acknowledge that exchange of students from one party to the other shall be subject to the availability of funds and shall comply with the regulations and policies of the First Party and the Second Party.
- 4.4 Any action research publications arising will be jointly published in accordance with the provisions laid out in Item 3.2.1C of the guidelines for the students to conduct research for their degree and PG program as trainees at ICAR institutions as notified *vide* Letter No. 2-8/2012-HRD dated 11th December, 2012 or revised guidelines, if any, as may be issued from time to time.
- 4.5 A copy of the thesis/ dissertation will be submitted to the First Party after the award of the degree by the Second Party.
- 4.6 All questions related to this MoU arising during and its term will be settled by the parties by mutual agreement. Disagreements at the operating level shall be forwarded to respective higher officials for appropriate resolutions failing which an arbitrator of mutual acceptance may be identified for the settlement of dispute, if any.
- 4.7 All questions not for seen related to this MoU will be handled by the parties by mutual discussion and agreement.
- 4.8 Nothing in this MoU is intended to affect cooperation or collaboration between the parties.

Article 5. Intellectual Property Rights

5.1 The Second Party will be expected to ensure protection of the Intellectual Property rights generated or likely to be generated during the student's research work or students' internship. The ICAR as the first applicant (for its institute) and the Second Party shall be the joint applicants for IPRs and the students and involved scientific staff shall be included as the inventor/ breeder/ author. The 'ICAR Guidelines for Intellectual Property Management and Technology Transfer/ Commercialization' as amended form time to time shall be the reference for exploitation of the generated intellectual property, whose management and benefits sharing shall be mutually decided in each case.

Article 6. Admission and Fees

- 6.1 All those who wish to register as trainees or for Master/ Doctoral program under this MoU, must apply for admission at the Second Party. The allocation of Major Guide/ Advisor would be finalized before the registration and will be governed by the provisions laid out in Items 3.2.1 A and 3.2.2A of the Guidelines for the students to conduct research for their degree programs as trainees at ICAR institutions as notified *vide* Letter No. 2-8/2012-HRD dated 11th December, 2012 or revised Guidelines, if any, as may be issued from time to time, for the students from within and outside NARS respectively.
- 6.2 Admission of the students and the award of degrees for different programs will be the responsibility of the Second Party as per the rules and regulations.
- 6.3 Allotment and involvement of the scientists and students at the First Party will be done by the approval of the Director of the First Party and Vice-Chancellor/Head of the Institution of the Second Party respectively.
- 6.4 The First Party would have the right to screen the student's eligibility for admission based on the academic performance.
- 6.5 The PME Cell of the First Party in consultation with the representative of the Second Party will decide the location and sharing quantum of research work.
- 6.6 The number of student(s) at any particular time will be subjected to the availability of research facilities and scientists time to guide thesis research at the First Party institution.
- 6.7 Any student(s) admitted to the First Party for training, post-graduate research, internship and placement exposure, if found violating the rules and regulations laid down by the First Party or indulged in such activities that amount to tarnishing the image of the Institute, or cause damage to the property, the registration of such student(s) would be summarily terminated. The Second Party will not complete the formalities of issuing the certificates to such students until they compensate the losses to the First Party.
- 6.8 Fees will be charged by the students from the First Party as per Guidelines for the students to conduct research for their degree programmes as trainees at ICAR institutions *vide* Letter No. 2-8/2012-HRD dated 11th December, 2012 or revised Guidelines, if any, as may be issued from time to time. No fee may be charged by the First Party from the students registered with AU/DU with NARS. However a student registered with a Second Party, outside NARS will deposit fee of Rs.10, 000/- for training duration of 3 months (not leading to a degree/dissertation) and Rs.30, 000/- per semester (six months) for training, research, dissertation exceeding three months. Any change in fee structure by ICAR will be applicable from the date of revision and shall be charged by the First Party.

Article 7. Entry into effect, modification and termination

- 7.1 This MoU shall become effective on the date it is signed by the parties and shall be valid for three years extendable up to five years. Both parties shall review the status of the MoU necessary. The period of validity of this MoU may be extended by mutual consent up to five years and beyond. eFresh Agribusiness Solutions Private Limited a private limited company with CIN U74999TG2017PTC115110, with its Registered office at Nakshatra Building, Ground Floor, Plot No. 473, Road No. 36, Jubilee Hills, Hyderabad-500033, Telangana, India (hereinafter called "eFresh" which expression, shall, unless repugnant to the context or meaning there of be deemed to mean and include its successors and permitted assignees, as the case may be), represented by its Managing Director, Srihari Kotela.

PARTY OF THE SECOND PART

WHEREAS eFresh vision is to bring about a modern revolution in the field of agriculture by connecting the farmers to scientific methods, quality inputs, technology solutions, rural infrastructure and ICT enabled market linkages. eFresh is also setting up farmers development centers and promoting digital platform for agriculture.

WHEREAS CUTM is running MS Swaminathan School of Agriculture and School of Management engaging students in B.Sc. Agriculture, M.Sc. Agriculture, B.Tech Agriculture, Master of Development Management (MDM) in building capability of rural farmers through sustainable rural development projects and activities while leveraging modern tools, technology and process and is keen to work with eFresh.

NOW THEREFORE, both parties after intense discussion have desired to work together in common areas as per following terms and conditions:

- 1. The MOU shall be effective from the date of its signature
- 2. The period of MOU shall be for three years to be extended by mutual consent for a further period of three years or more. This can be terminated on mutual consent of both the parties.
- 3. CUTM propose to set up Farmers Development Centre (herein after referred in this MOU as FDC) at the Campus of M.S Swaminathan School of Agriculture with its own cost and all technical and knowledge support will be provided by eFresh.

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- 4. eFresh shall depute its expert once in a month during the course of first crop season to review the operations, progress, and future course of action and the CUTM shall make necessary arrangement for boarding and lodging of the experts.
- 5. All the agri inputs & farm tools, for display or sale at FDC will be supplied by eFresh at the cost as mutually agreed by both the parties from time to time.
- 6. eFresh will promote agri entrepreneurs in important crop production centres for setting up of FDCs under franchisee Model. CUTM will facilitate necessary training for the skill development of "Identified agripreneures" and the cost of training and other facilities will be mutually agreed upon by both the parties.
- 7. CUTM students under internship will be engaged at eFresh FDCs for promoting digital platform for agriculture. CUTM shall forward the students profiles in advance to eFresh for review and agreeing upon the final list of candidates for internship. eFresh shall pay the students under internship a consolidated amount of ₹ 5,000/- per month towards stay and other expenses.
- 8. Evaluation process of interns will be as per CUTM guidelines.
- 9. eFresh will be one of the domain partners for the agriculture students of CUTM.
- 10. eFresh and CUTM will explore the possibilities of developing farm tools and other innovations and marketing the same for the benefit of farming community.
- 11. CUTM agrees and assures eFresh that it shall not by itself or through its affiliates, without first obtaining the written consent of eFresh, set up or replicate the FDCs business model either on its own or in co-operation with others/organizations during the period of this MOU or within three years after the expiry of this MOU or on termination by either Part.
- 12. The sharing of success stories or learning's of FDCs Business model with the third parties or in any mode to be made with the consent in writing from the eFresh.
- 13. On termination/expiry of this MOU, both the parties shall promptly deliver the Confidential Information marked as confidential and copies in physical form in its possession, if any, and shall destroy the soft copies and the same to be informed in writing to both the parties.
- 14. The parties hereto acknowledge and agree that in the event of a breach of the provisions of this MOU the party not in breach shall be entitled to injunctive relief against such breach or threatened breach, by the party in breach of this MOU, without prejudice to other remedies available under law.
- 15. All notices to be given under this MOU by any party to the other shall be in writing in English language and sent by registered mail / postage prepaid addressed to the other part at the addresses set forth above and also by email to the addresses mentioned above.
- 16. This Agreement will be governed by the Indian laws and the courts of Bhubaneswar shall have exclusive jurisdiction over all matters pertaining to this Agreement.
- 17. This Agreement shall not be amended, assigned or transferred by either party without the written consent of the other party.

For implementation of Building institutional collaboration for arranging support towards clinical teaching, practical training, internship training and placement of paramedical and allied health science students of Centurion University of Technology and Management henceforth referred to as the *Project* for the agreement in subsequent paragraphs.

That the both parties agreed to the scope of this agreement for effective implementation of the *project* as per the laid down terms and conditions

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Background and Scope of the partnership agreement:

Optometry, and HSSC approved skill building courses e.g., Refractionist and Vision Technician.

The CUTM plans to become a clinical establishment and offer outdoor based preventive, promotive and curative eye care services for its students, staff and to community in Jatni as part of its social services and Corporate Social Responsibility initiative.

The Kar Vision Eye Hospital situated in Bhubaneswar is a reputed and recognized clinical establishment providing speciality eye care services. It is equipped with various modern and state of art instruments & equipment, facilities and provides regular outdoor and indoor services in the domain of primary, secondary and tertiary eye care services.

The Kar Vision Eye Hospital situated in Bhubaneswar is agreeable to enter into a resource sharing model of collaboration to provide opportunity for clinical teaching, practical training, internship training and placement of paramedical and allied health science students of CUTM.

The scope of the agreement would be as following:

- Providing technical and managerial support towards the following activities:
- o Review, revise and upgrade academic curriculum(s) for training/teaching to make it industry oriented
- Participate as resource persons for conducting internal assessment, external assessment and faculty development.
- Providing support in organizing an industry visit and conduct primary orientation on eye care industry perspectives to B. Optometry and Skill development course students after their joining the course at SPAHS, CUTM Jatni for 1 day.
- Providing clinical teaching and practical training opportunity under supervision in eye care clinical/ industry setup for
- 15-21 days under supervision as per course content during 3rd and 5th semester of B. Optometry course

o 07-10 days in the 2nd and 3rd month of Vision Technician and Refractionist course.

- Providing internship opportunity under supervision in eye care clinical/ industry setup for
- o 1 year during 7th & 8th semester as per course content of B. Optometry students
- 6 months for post completion of skill training course content of VT/RT

Providing placement opportunity in eye care clinical/ industry setup after campus interview for

- B. Optometry students after successful graduation
- VT/RT skill development students after successful completion of the course and certification by HSSC.

That, both the parties agrees to implement the project whose details are given in Annexure-1.

The implementation of the project would take place in the Kar Vision Eye Hospital, Bhubaneswar and in the School of Paramedic & Allied Health Sciences (SPAHS), Centurion University of Technology & Management, Jatni campus.

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The timeline for implementation of the project would be from August 28, 2018 onwards for a period of 3 years which may be extendable with due consent of both the parties.

The implementation of the project effectively and efficiently will be guided, supervised and implemented by an Executive committee which will periodically meet and review progress in implementation for expansion and improvement of clinical training services. The constitution of the committees and functioning of the committees will be guided by the Terms of reference and Scope of work defined respectively.

The roles and responsibilities for implementation of the project would be shared between partners as per details given below:

Roles of the first party:

- The first party would select a nodal officer who would be the point person for day to day coordination, facilitation, review, monitoring of the progress of project with the 2nd party to implement project as per timeline.
- The first party will nominate <u>three</u> officials for representing 1st party in the Executive committee like, Nominee of the Management, Medical Director and Hospital Manager.
- The first party will be responsible for jointly designing of new courses, periodic review & up-gradation
 of the existing teaching training curriculums through an expert committee to design/modify courses to
 make them health sector industry oriented.
- 4. The first party will be responsible for identification and deputation of suitably qualified doctors/ trainer for delivering quality training and skilling support, internal and external assessments, quality assurance of training/teaching and health research activities in SPAHS, CUTM and in Kar Vision Eye Hospital as per subject domain.
- 5. The first party would remain responsible for monitoring the quality of the clinical teaching, practical training, internship training and placement of paramedical and allied health science students of Centurion University as part of project services implemented by the 2nd party. The 1st party would be responsible to give feedback based on monitoring observations to the 2nd party if any need for improvement is observed in written, over telephone, through e-mail immediately/ as soon as possible.
- 6. The first party would give technical inputs for finalization of the activities in the clinical establishment at CUTM.
- 7. The first party would coordinate and convene periodic (monthly/ quarterly) review meetings with the executive committee. This meeting would address solutions of problems that are put up by the 2nd party to facilitate implementation of the project as per timeline.

Roles of the second party:

- 1. The second party will <u>select a nodal officer</u> who would be the point person for day to day coordination, facilitation and necessary discussion with the 1st party to move the project as per timeline.
- The second party will <u>nominate three officials</u> for representing 2nd party in the Executive committee like, Nominee of the Management; Dean, School of Paramedical and Allied Health Sciences; and Director, School of Paramedics and Allied Health Sciences, CUTM University.
- The second party will be responsible for jointly designing and implementation of new courses, periodic review & up-gradation of the existing teaching training curriculums through an expert committee to implement the courses to make them health sector industry oriented.
- The second party would be <u>responsible for applying</u>, <u>certification</u> to state appropriate authority for transforming the School of Paramedics and Allied Health Sciences, CUTM as a clinical establishment as per statutory rules.
- 5. The second party will be responsible for providing managerial, logistics support for delivering the clinical services in the CUTM as a clinical establishment.

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- 6. The second party will be responsible for upkeep and maintenance of various clinical infrastructure, facilities and equipment to provide clinical services like outdoor and investigation (pathology, radio diagnostic, optometry, cardiac care, dental care, physiotherapy etc.,) services in phased manner.
- 7. The second party would be responsible to undertake corrective actions immediately or within reasonable time to respond based on monitoring observations by the 1st party.
- 8. The second party would coordinate and convene periodic (monthly/ quarterly) review meetings with the executive committee. This meeting would address solutions of problems that are put up by the 1st party to facilitate implementation of the project as per timeline.

WHEREAS the "First Party" is involved in the **Research on gender issues in agriculture and allied fields;** Gender-equitable agricultural policies/ programmes and gender-sensitive agricultural-sector responses; Co-ordinate research on Women in Agriculture (specific mandated domain within the approved disciplines/divisions), AND WHEREAS the "Second Party", established vide F. No...2161 dated 24.12.2010 by Govt. of India /Govt. of Odisha (Name of the Agency) vide Act No. 04 of 2010 and recognized by university grants commission] CUTM is involved in Teaching, Research and Extension of under graduate and post graduate studies in the field Agriculture and allied Science (specific areas of research).

AND WHEREAS it has been considered expedient to agree in writing to participate jointly in the projects requiring expertise and logistics from both the parties.

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Article 1. Scope

1.1 The Second party will recognize the First party as an Institute for conducting research related to the thesis requirement of the research students for B.Sc (Ag), B.F.Sc., B.Tech Ag - Internship and PG **Programme**. The Second party will recognize Scientists of the ICAR Institute as recommended by its Director in accordance with the University rules and regulations for guiding students working for the said degree.

1.2 Operational details of research effort and collaboration will be made in common research programmes and/or projects restricted to specific mandated domain within the approved disciplines/divisions. The objective(s) for research work for a student coming from a Second party outside NARS should be exclusively different as far as possible.

1.3 Research instrumentation facility and library facilities available with the First party and The Second party will be made available to the faculty and research scholars. However, the costs of specific consumables will be borne by the respective organizations.

1.4 There shall be an exchange of students for academic, research and training purposes. Accommodation in the Hostel shall be arranged, wherever possible, as per extant rates. The duration of exchange visits will be determined by mutual consent between both the parties.

Article 2. Management

2.1 Director of the First party and the Vice-Chancellor/Head of the Institution of the Second party will be responsible to work out operational details of co-operation between the two organizations and ensure proper and effective implementation of this MoU.

2.2 The Advisory Committee will meet at least once in a year alternatively in the institutions of the First party and the Second party to review the activities. This meeting shall include presentation on the academic and research activities, which should be open to the students, faculty and scientists. **Article 3. Exchange of Information**

3.1. The term "information" includes scientific or technical data, results and/or methods investigation, and other information intended to be provided, exchanged, or arising under project descriptions entered into pursuant to this MoU.

3.2. The parties support the widest possible dissemination of information. Each party in joint projects shall be given the right to use, disclose, publish or disseminate such information for any and all purposes.

Article 4. General Provisions

4.1 It is understood that the First party and the Second party subscribe to the principle of equal opportunity and do not discriminate on the basis of race, sex, age, caste or religion. Both the Institutions shall abide by these principles in the administration of this agreement and neither party shall impose criteria for exchange of scholars or students, which violate principles of non-discrimination

4.3 Both parties acknowledge that exchange of students from one party to the other shall be subject to the availability of funds and shall comply with the regulations and policies of the First party and the Second party.

4.4 Any research publications arising will be jointly published in accordance with the provisions laid out in Item 3.2.1C of the Guidelines for the students to conduct research for their degree programme as trainees at ICAR institutions as notified *vide* Letter No. 2-8/2012-HRD dated 11th December, 2012 or revised guidelines, if any, as may be issued from time to time.

4.5 A copy of the thesis/dissertation will be submitted to the First Party after the award of the degree by the Second party.

4.6 All questions related to this MoU arising during its term will be settled by the parties by mutual agreement. Disagreements at the operating level shall be forwarded to respective higher officials for appropriate resolution failing which an arbitrator of mutual acceptance may be identified for the settlement of dispute, if any.

4.7 All questions not foreseen related to this MoU will be handled by the parties by mutual agreement.4.8 Nothing in this MoU is intended to affect other cooperation or collaborations between the parties.Article 5. Intellectual Property Rights

5.1 The Second party will be expected to ensure protection of the Intellectual Property Rights generated or likely to be generated during the student's research work. The ICAR as the first applicant (for its institute) and the Second party shall be the joint applicants for IPRs and the students and involved scientific staff shall be included as the inventor/breeder/author. The 'ICAR Guidelines for Intellectual Property Management and Technology Transfer/Commercialization' as amended from time to time shall be the reference for exploitation of the generated intellectual property, whose management and benefits sharing shall be mutually decided in each case.

Article 6. Admission and Fees

6.1 All those who wish to register as trainees or for Master/Doctoral programme under this MoU must apply for admission at the Second party. The allocation of Major Guide/Advisor would be finalized before the registration and will be governed by the provisions laid out in Items 3.2.1A and 3.2.2A of the Guidelines for the students to conduct research for their degree programmes as trainees at ICAR institutions as notified *vide* Letter No. 2-8/2012-HRD dated 11th December, 2012 or revised Guidelines, if any, as may be issued from time to time, for the students from within NARS and Outside NARS, respectively.

6.2 Admission of the students and the award of degrees for different programmes will be the responsibility of the Second party as per the rules and regulations.

6.3 Allotment of the students at the First party will be done by the approval of Director of the First party and Vice-Chancellor/Head of the Institution of the Second party.

6.4 The First party would have the right to screen the student's eligibility for admission based on their academic period.

6.6 The number of student(s) at any particular time will be subjected to the availability of research facilities and scientists' time to guide thesis research at the First party institution.

6.7 Any student(s) admitted to the First party for training/postgraduate research, if found violating the rules and regulations laid down by the First party or indulge in such activities that amount to tarnishing the image of the Institute, or cause damage to the property, the registration of such student(s) would be summarily terminated. The Second party will not complete the formalities of issuing the certificates to such students until they compensate the losses to the First party.

6.8 Fees will be charged from the students by the First party as per Guidelines for the students to conduct research for their degree programmes as trainees at ICAR institutions *vide* Letter No. 2-8/2012-HRD dated 11th December, 2012 or revised Guidelines, if any, as may be issued from time to time. No fee may be charged by the First party from the students registered with AU/DU within NARS. However a student registered with a Second party, outside NARS, will deposit fee of Rs. 10,000/- for training duration of 3 months (not leading to a degree/dissertation) and Rs. 30,000/- per semester (six months) for training, research, dissertation exceeding three months. Any change in fee structure by ICAR will be applicable from the date of revision and shall be charged by the First party.

Article 7. Entry into effect, modification and termination

7.1. This MoU shall become effective on the date it is signed by the parties and shall be valid for three years extendable up to five years. Both parties shall review the status of the MoU at the end of each three/five year period to determine any modification, whenever necessary. The period of validity of this MoU may be extended by mutual consent up to five years. This MoU may be amended by mutual written agreement and may be terminated at any time by either party upon written notification signed by the competent authority of the party initiating termination. Such notification must be given to the other party at least six months in advance from the effective date of termination.

7.2. All joint activities not completed at the expiration or termination of the MoU may be continued until their completion under the terms of this MoU.

7.3 No amendment or modification of the MoU shall be valid unless the same is made in writing by both the parties or their authorized representatives and specifically stating the same to be amendment of the MoU. The modifications/changes shall become part of the MoU and shall be effective from the date on which they are made/executed, unless otherwise agreed to.
