Centurion University actively promotes student participation and representation in a wide range of academic and non-academic aspects of the university's service delivery in order to place an emphasis on students' overall growth. As a result of this effort, students will not only be given a voice, but also a sense of responsibility as young adults.

Students typically participate in the form of individual representatives chosen by the students themselves or committees formed specifically to address specific issues. Several student committees have been formed, each focusing on a different aspect of curricular, co-curricular, and extra-curricular growth.

Committees- Cultural Committee, the Sports Committee, the Responsibility Committee, and the Core Coordinators Team for the Cultural, Sports, and Responsibility (CSR) Committee all exist within the Student Association. The Student Representatives include the Anti-Ragging Committee, the Hostel Committee, the Mess Committee, the Anti-Drug Brigade, the Class Representative, and the Placement Coordinators.



Cultural- Alumni and student representatives make up a portion of the Board of Studies. Some of the different Social Responsibility wings include the National Service Scheme (NSS) Coordinators, the National Cadet Corps (NCC) Platoon, the Youth Red Cross (YRC) Coordinators, the Bharat Scout and Guides (BSG) Team, the Gender Champions, and the Special Police Officers (SPOs).

The priority method ensures student- It representation in academic and administrative committees. Each class and department has a student association with Class Representatives. An interview is performed to choose association members. Anti-Ragging, Hostel, Mess, Anti-Drug Brigade, Placement coordinator, Gender champions, Special Police Officer, and Board of Studies student committees are student-run.

Senior faculty members are in charge of supervising the association (CSR Core Coordinators), and they are also responsible for ensuring that the association's meetings, as well as student activities, competitions, and events, run smoothly. The student association is heavily involved in a variety of extracurricular activities on campus, including cultural and sports activities, as well as those focusing on social responsibility and other topics. Members of the National Service Scheme (NSS) Coordinators, National Cadet Corps (NCC) Platoon, Youth Red Cross (YRC) Coordinators, and Bharat Scout and Guides (BSG) Team are involved in a variety of activities throughout the year. Each wing, such as the Cultural, Sports, and Responsibility wings, has its own dedicated committees for improved coordination and more efficient implementation.

Academic clubs- These are active on all of our campuses, and students plan, organize, and execute campus- and community-wide events.
