(3T4B) enzyme. It was found that Lupeol helped to prevent Hepatitis C.

Introduction: Potentila anserine is known for its medicinal activities. The whole plant is antispasmodic, mildly astringent, diuretic, foot care, haemostatic, odontalgic and tonic.
