

DISASTER

The serious disruption of the functioning of society, causing widespread human, material or environmental losses, which exceed the ability of the affected people to cope using their own resources.


An event, either man-made or natural, sudden or progressive, causing widespread human, material or environmental losses

Disaster (As per DM Act, 2005)

Disaster means a catastrophe, mishap, calamity or grave occurrence affecting any area from natural and manmade causes, or by accident or negligence, which results in substantial loss of life or human suffering or damage to, and destruction of property, or damage to, or degradation of environment and is of such a nature and magnitude as to be beyond the capacity of the community of the affected areas.

HAZARD

Phenomenon or situation, which has the potential to cause disruption or damage to people, their property, their


Vulnerability



Is a condition or sets of conditions that reduces people's ability to prepare for, withstand or respond to a hazard



Safer communities and sustainable development through diseaser reduction



Capacity

Those positive condition or abilities which increase a community's ability to deal with hazards.



Risk

The probability that a community's structure or geographic area is to be damaged or disrupted by the impact of a particular hazard, on account of their nature, construction. and proximity to a hazardous area.

Relief

The process undertaken by a disaster affected community to fully restore itself to pre-disaster level of functioning.

Rehabilitation



Actions taken in the aftermath of a disaster to:

- assist victims to repair their dwellings;
- re-establish essential services;
- revive key economic and social activities

Reconstruction



Permanent measures to repair or replace damaged dwellings and infrastructure and to set the economy back on course.






Prevention






Mitigation
